

North Shore Art League Announces Lecture Series

Plans for a new and interesting activity of the North Shore Art league were developed at a meeting of a special committee at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Ullrich, 925 Lake avenue, Wilmette. For some time, the necessity has been felt of broadening the appeal of the league, and its service to north shore communities, by combining with its more intensive work some feature of general and popular interest. As a result of the efforts of this committee, arrangements have been made whereby a series of lectures will be given by Dudley Crafts Watson, under the auspices of the league.

This will be the first series of lectures to be delivered by Mr. Watson since his extended European tour of the past summer, and interest will be added to them by the slides with which they will be illustrated. The lectures will be given at Matz hall, Community House, Winnetka, at 8 o'clock on the following evenings, and on the following subjects:

October 10, Art and Life in Spain; October 17, Art and Life in Italy; October 24, Art and Life in England; November 7, Twenty of the World's Master Painters; November 14, Great Living American Painters; November 21, The Enjoyment of Modern Art.
