Miss Leila Withers, daughter of the A. L. Withers of 788 Lincoln avenue, has returned to the Masters school, Dobbs-Ferry.

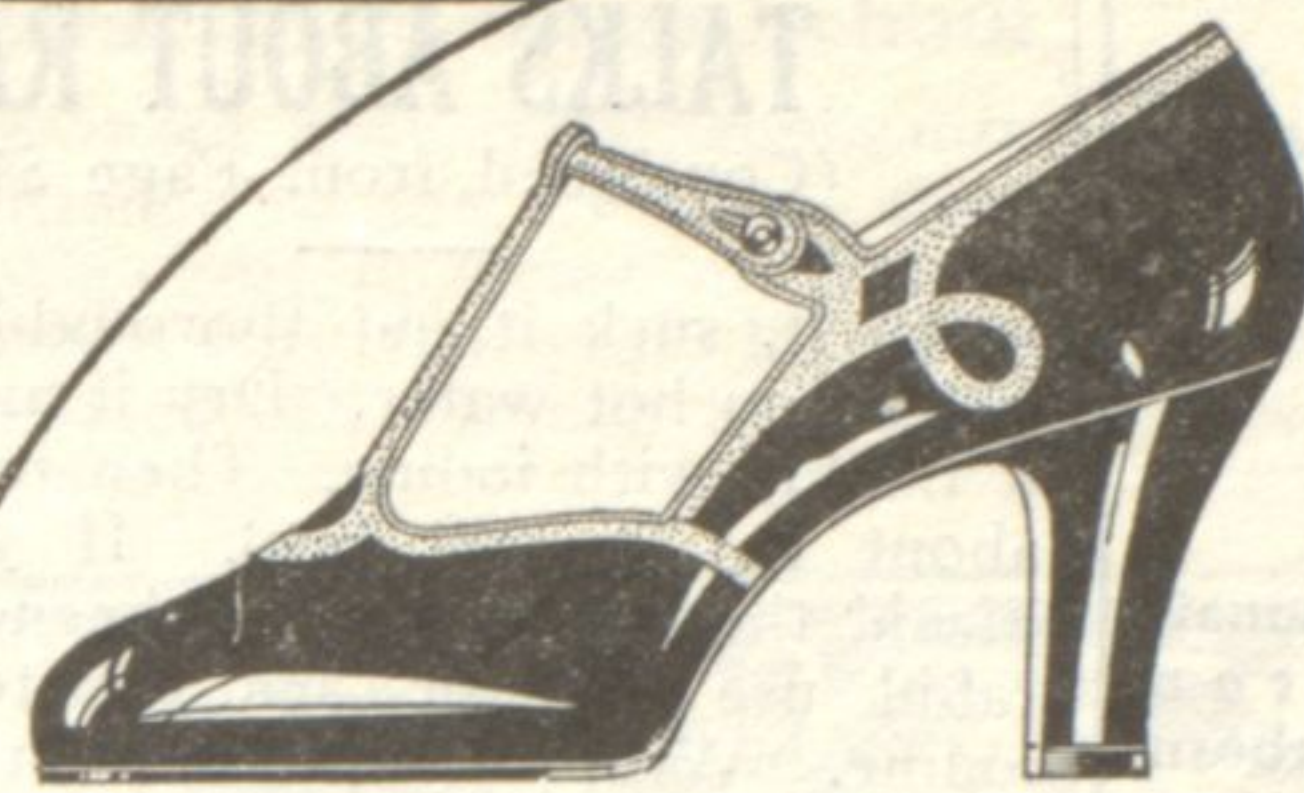
Former Winnetka Girl Has Place With Film Magazine
