Plans to open its annual membership campaign October 1, were made when chairmen of the North Shore Theater guild held their first meeting of the season last Friday.

Weese of Kenilworth; Mrs. Merritt Lum of Winnetka; Mrs. Alan Wolff of Highland Park; Mrs. Dorothy Ross of Glencoe and Mrs. Alfred McCullough of Lake Forest.

David Owen, new director of the guild, who succeeds Alexander Dean, was present and spoke, outlining his plans for the season and discussing the work he has done with dramatics at the University of Michigan. John Allen Stewart, publicity director and business manager, announced the schedule for the season's productions and other plans. Membership quotas, he reported, have been assigned the various towns and a substantial growth is expected.

The North Shore Theater guild, so far as is known, is the only Little Theater group in America, which travels every season on a definite circuit. Glencoe has been added to the circuit this season, making six towns, from Evanston to Lake Forest, in which the guild presents its several plays each season. The total membership in the guild is now approximately 1,500.

The officers of the guild are: president, Laird Bell; vice-president, Samuel S. Otis; secretary, Mrs. Frederick Dickinson; and treasurer, J. Williams Macv.

N. U. Enrollment Approaches 10,000 Late Figures Show

Despite an effort to keep down the registration at Northwestern university because of lack of classroom facilities and instructional force, practically every school has an increase in enrollment, according to figures available this week.

Up to Tuesday morning nearly 9,500 students had enrolled in the schools on the Evanston and McKinlock campuses, a substantial increase over the registration at the same time last year. The school of commerce on the McKinlock campus, with a registration of 4,156, leads all the other schools by a big margin. Many of this number, however, are business men and women attending the night classes.

The school of liberal arts on the Evanston campus ranks next with an enrollment of 2275. The other schools on the Evanston campus showed the following number enrolled yesterday: graduate school, 235; school of engineering, 252; school of music, 259; school of commerce, 361; school of journalism, 79; school of speech 256; school of education, 105.

The greatest increase was in the school of education, which was established as a separate school last year. The total enrollment in this school for 1926-27 was 50.

In the Medill school of Journalism on the McKinlock campus, 200 students have enrolled; in the dental school 388 have registered and in the school of medicine 480. No figures are yet available on the registration for the school of law.
