

**Brief Illness
Proves Fatal to
Jesse B. Alton**

Jesse Baibrige Alton, 577 Cherry street, passed away on Tuesday of last week at the age of 69 years following an illness of only four days. Simple but impressive services were conducted from the home the following Thursday afternoon with Rev. James Austin Richards of the Winnetka Congregational church officiating. He was laid to rest at Rose Hill cemetery.

Mr. Alton had been a resident of Winnetka for more than 26 years and during that period had been greatly interested in the affairs of the community in which he had chosen to reside. He was at one time a member of the Village council and was at all times actively co-operative in such movements as were for the betterment of the village.

In the Congregational church, of which he was a member, Mr. Alton was an ever willing worker. He took an active part in the recent campaign for the new building which the church is erecting and was one of its most ardent promoters.

During the World War, Mr. Alton was in the field work of the American Red Cross. Since that time he has not been well. The illness which proved fatal to him last week, however, was not of this origin, coming suddenly and taking him at a time when he was considered to be in fairly good health.

He is survived by his widow, a son, Robert L. Alton, and a daughter, Mrs. Wellington Coolidge, 794 Lincoln avenue, Winnetka.

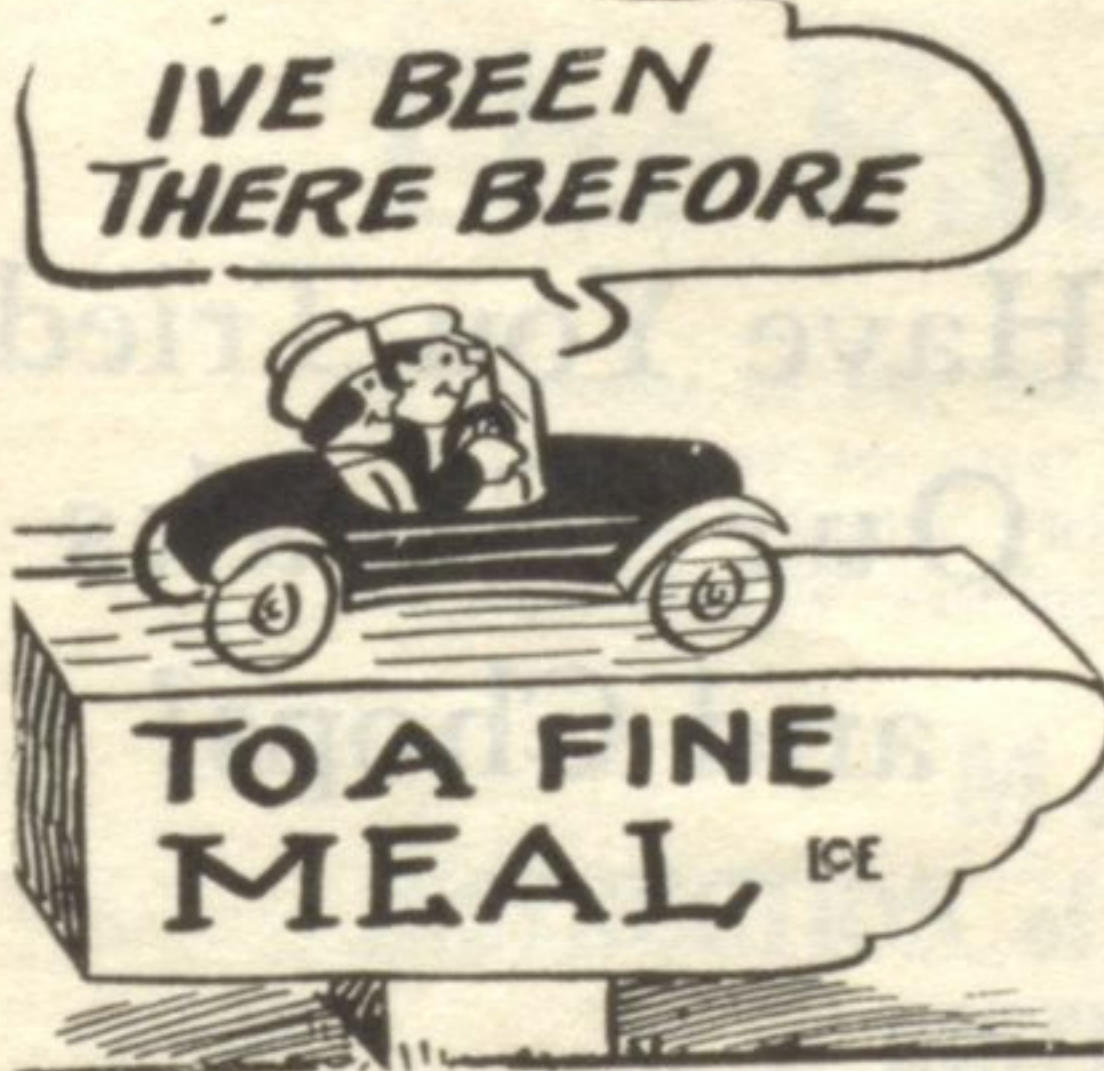
