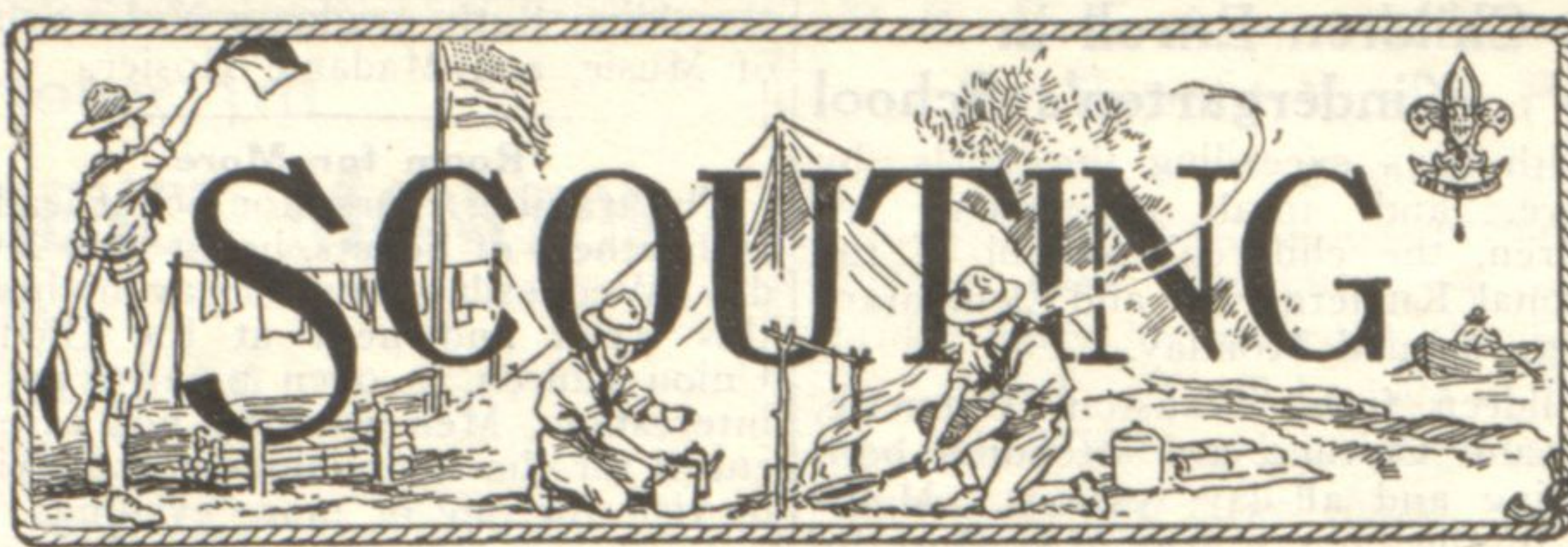


Mrs. Alexander Reichman, formerly of Kenilworth, entertained at luncheon on Tuesday at her home in Barrington.

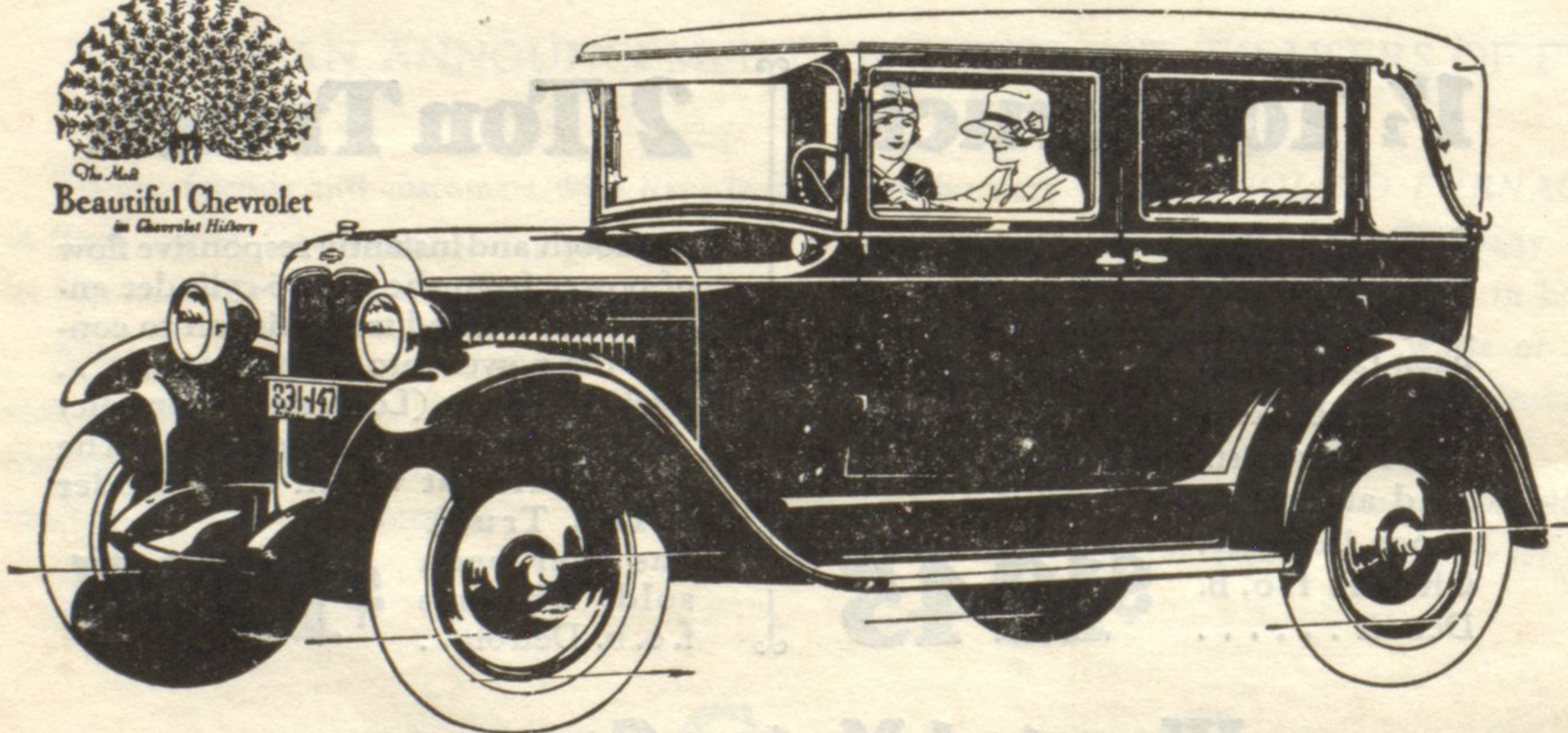
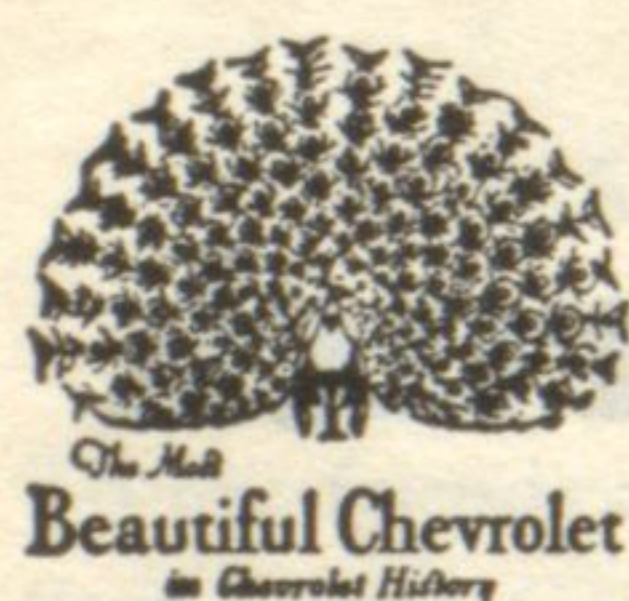
