October has been decided upon as the month for the "Invest in Boyhood" campaign to be carried on by the men of the various north shore communities in securing the funds to carry on the Boy Scout work of the North Shore Area council for the coming year.

Because of the rapid increase in Scouting during the past year, both in quantity and the enrichment of quality, the men of the north shore council, Boy Scouts of America, are setting out to raise a larger budget to make possible a rapidly growing program. The \$12,000 quota which is being sought will be used in the carrying out of a stronger advancement program, service to troop committeemen, equipment for camping and outdoor activities, for the educational program, for training, for activities such as field and rally days, for administration, executives' salaries, and traveling expenses in going from town to town.

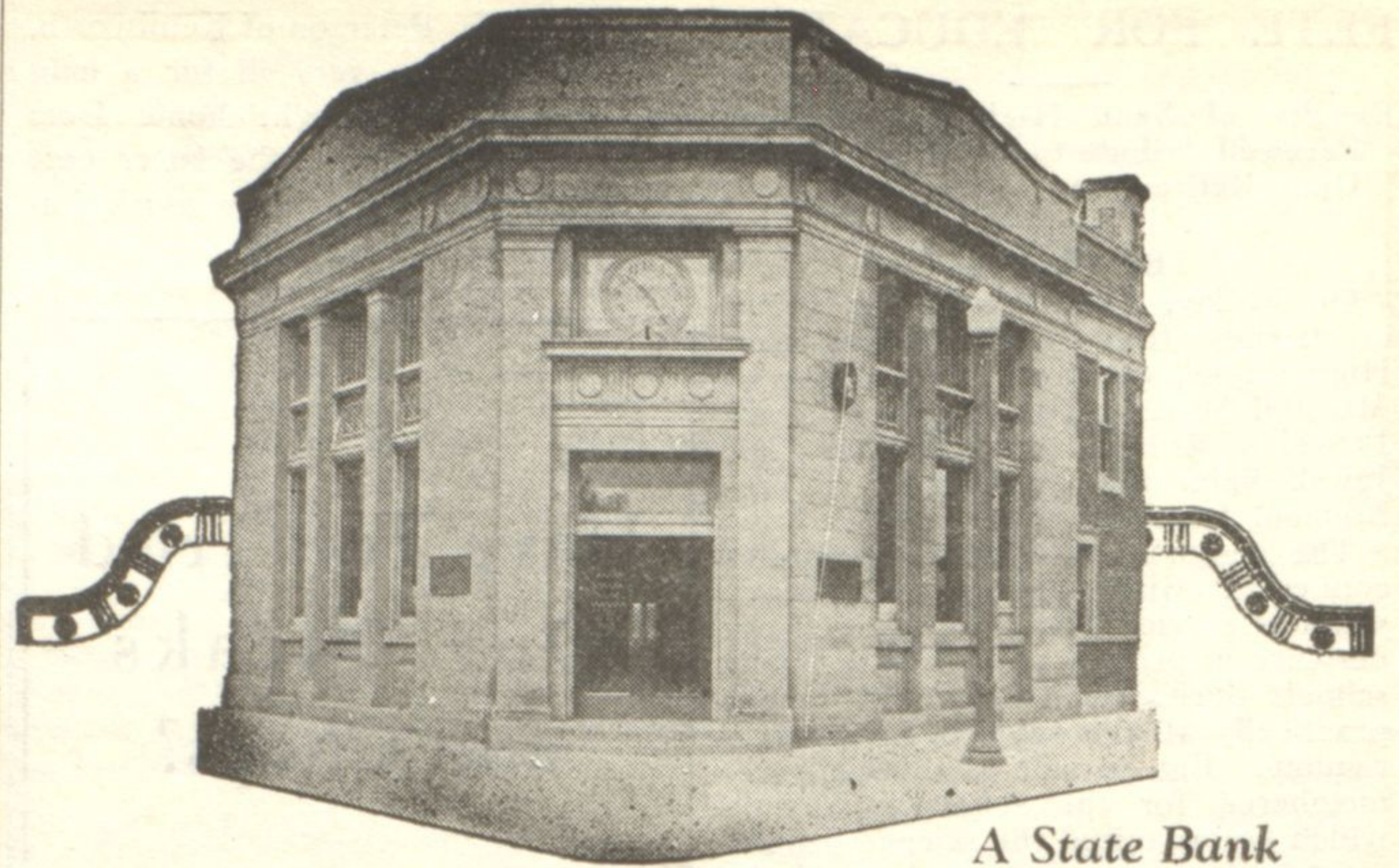
Announce Patron List for Watson Lectures
