**New Trier Registration
Now Totals 1,640 Pupils**

The registration at New Trier High school now totals 1,640 pupils, it was announced this week by Wesley L. Brown, registrar. The enrollment represents an increase of 170 students over last year, which is the largest increase since 1922, and for the first time in the history of the school the number of girls enrolled is greater than

the number of boys. While this condition is normal in practically every high school, it has never before been current at the local institution, it is said. The girls number 843 and the boys 797.
