The section of the building to be devoted to the dairy will be the east room. There will also be two store rooms and offices on the second floor.

The section of the new building devoted to the dairy business will be equipped with the very latest machinery for handling and caring for milk and cream and the other commodities of this company. These include butter-milk, cottage cheese, American cheese, Swiss cheese, strictly fresh eggs and butter. The butter they receive three times a week directly from the Wisconsin creameries.
