

Congregationalist Leader to Preach in Winnetka Sunday

Rev. Robert J. Locke, superintendent of the Illinois Conference of Congregational churches, will preach the sermon at the evening worship in the Winnetka Congregational church, October 16.

Dr. Locke was at one time pastor of the Congregational church in Champaign, Ill., which is attended by hundreds of the State university students as well as many of the faculty and townspeople. It was from this pastorate that he was called about a year ago to take charge of the larger interest of the denomination throughout the state. He and his associate, Rev. Walter Spooner, render great service to the churches of the state, giving wise counsel in their local problems and bringing to the local needs the help and encouragement of the whole state fellowship. He will speak about the united task of the churches of Illinois in which the Winnetka church has a share.

While the Winnetka church has never been sectarian, a very large part of its benevolences and its service outside of the community have been through and in the congregational fellowship and this address of the Rev. Mr. Lockes will, therefore, be very pertinent, it is pointed out.
