Christian Science Church

"Are Sin, Disease, and Death Real?" was the subject in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday, October 9.

The Golden Text was from Psalms 103:2, 3, "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forgot not all his benefits; who forgiveth all thine iniquities, who healeth all thy diseases."

Among the citations which comprised the lesson-sermon was the following from the Bible: "And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people. But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd. Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:35-38).

The lesson-sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "There is neither a present nor an eternal co-partnership between error and Truth, between flesh and Spirit. God is as incapable of producing sin, sickness, and death as He is of experiencing these errors (p. 356).

Never Start Your Car in Closed Garage, Warning

"Winter will bring added danger from carbon monoxide," warns Charles M. Hayes of Winnetka, president of the Chicago Motor club. "Motorists should remember that operating a car in a closed garage may mean death; that carbon monoxide is an odorless, invisible gas which causes death without warning.

"There is little warning of the onset of the poisoning, and it may quickly prove fatal. Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas present in the automobile engine exhaust, and is a product of incomplete combustion. Nausea, headache, dizziness, and drowsiness are symptoms of gas poisoning. Persons overcome by gas should be removed at once to the fresh air and, if breathing has stopped, given artificial respiration. Meanwhile, send for a doctor and an oxygen-carbon dioxide inhaler.

"Motor should never be started in a closed garage," concludes Mr. Hayes.

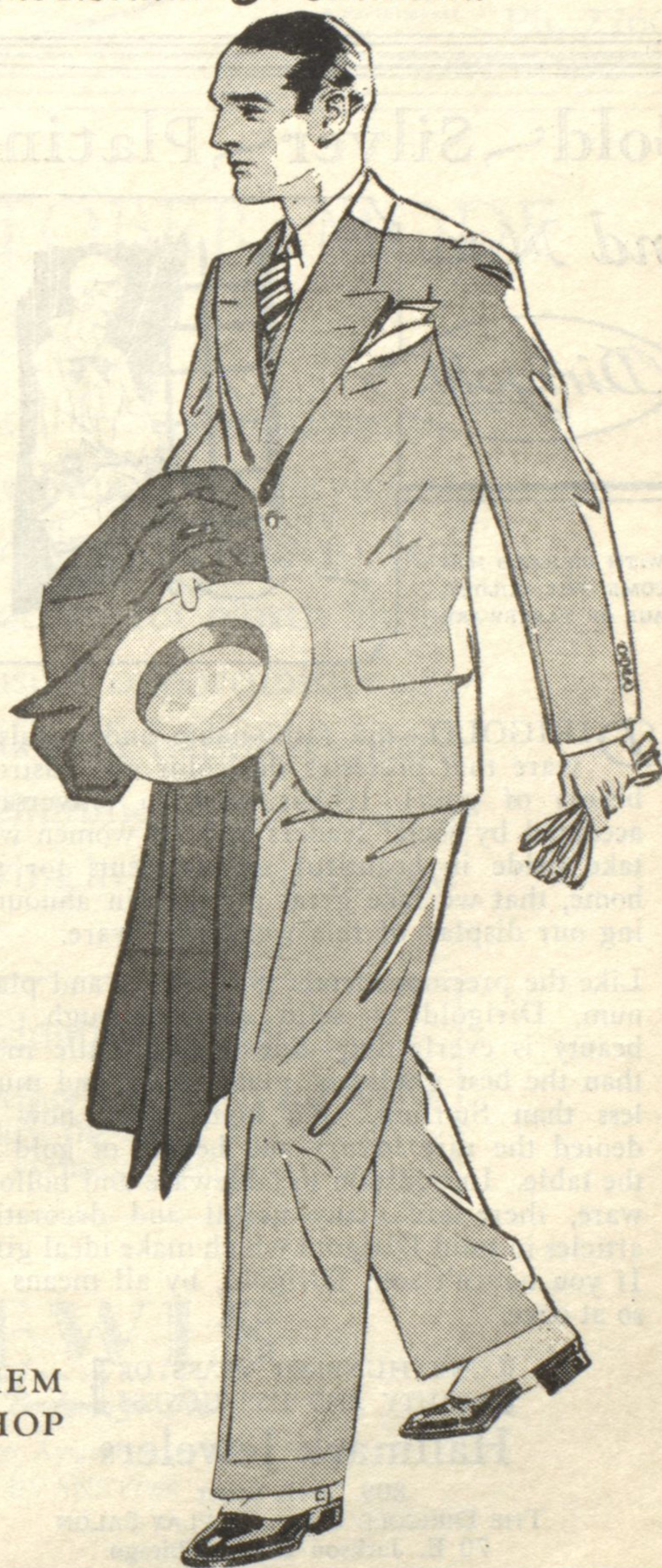
