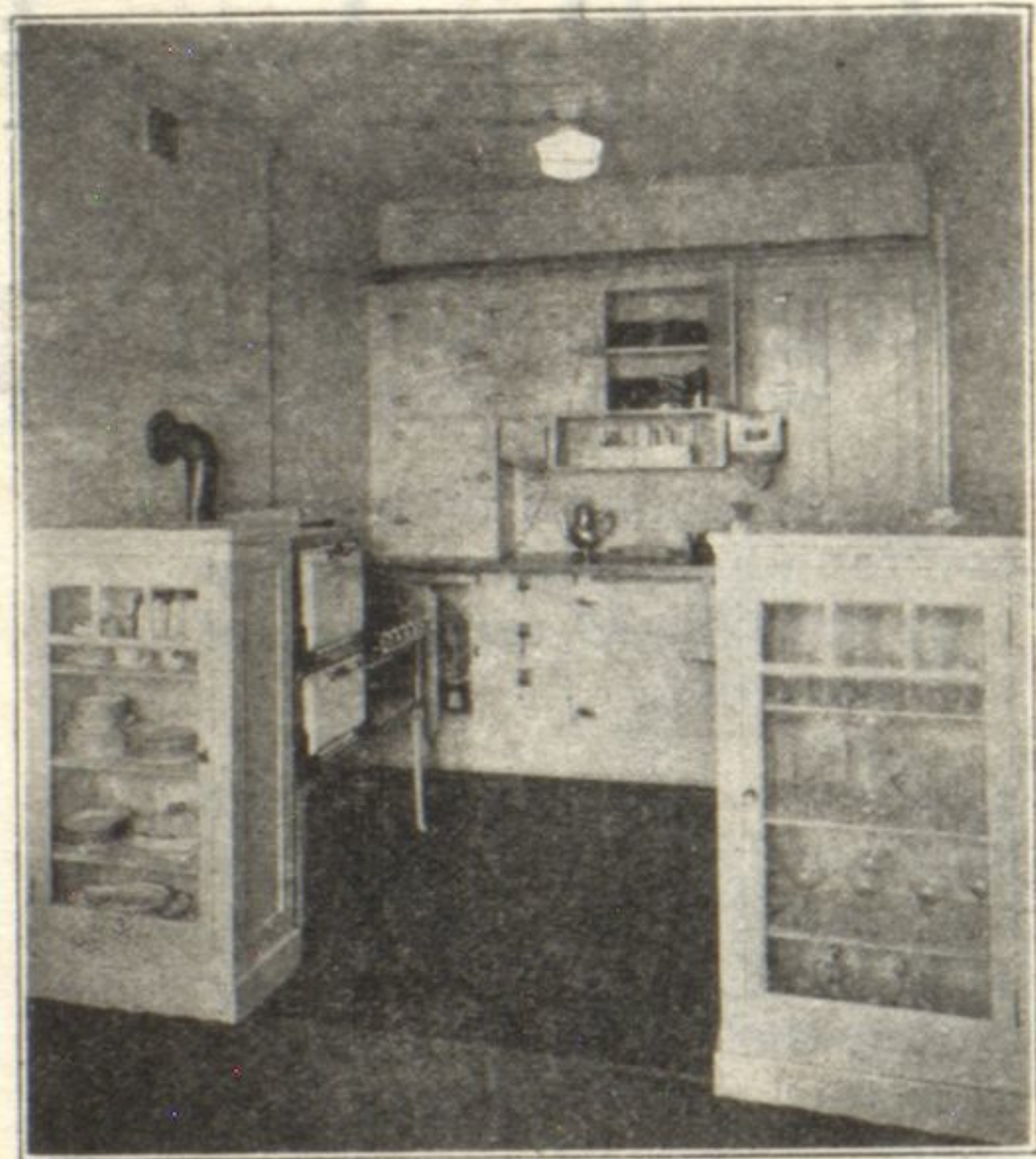

North Shore Line Rated Fastest Electric Road

The Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee railroad has been officially designated as the fastest electrically-operated railway in the United States. This record was established last week with awarding of the speed trophy to the North Shore line at the 46th annual convention of the American Electric Railway association at Cleveland, Ohio.

The award was made on the basis of operations during the past year. Official records show that the North Shore line during that period operated its trains over 87.19 miles of track between Chicago and Milwaukee at an average speed of 53.9 miles per hour, not including stops, and 41.8 miles per hour, including 14 regular schedule stops.

An Auto for Every Five in U. S., Statistics Show

Shipments of automotive freight last year totalled in excess of 3,280,000 freight car loads, gasoline leading the list with 910,000 carloads, according to the Chicago Motor club.

There is one automobile to every five persons in the United States, and one to every sixty-six persons in the world, according to commercial reports received by the club, and the growing use of automotive equipment outside the United States is shown in figures which reveal a total of 5,512,923 motor vehicles in foreign lands at the beginning of this year, as against 2,931,407 on January 1, 1914.
