The following three weeks he is to lecture on "The Mind of Christ about Our Relationship to Each Other," about the "Kingdom of God and Man," about "Himself."

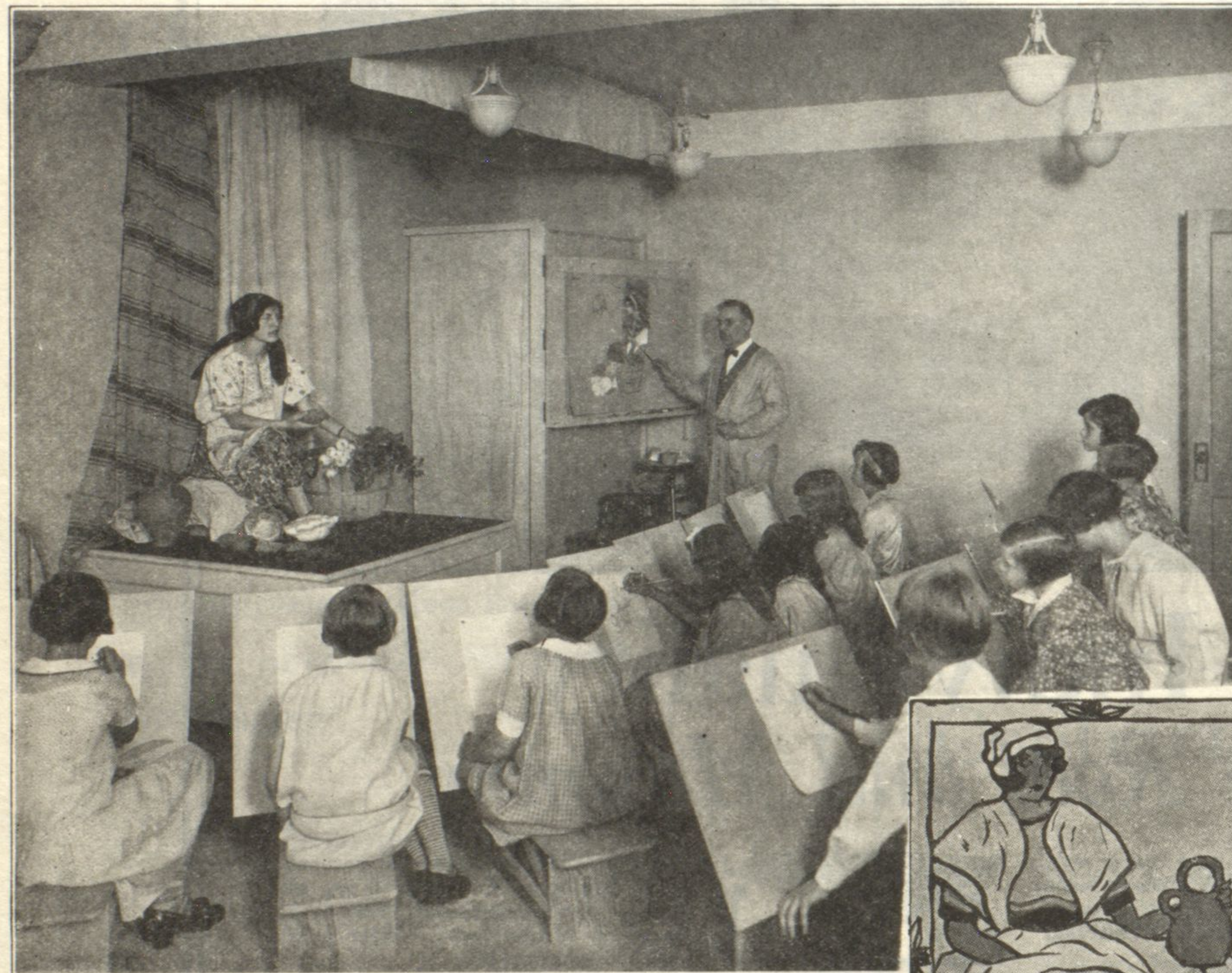
Opportunity for Leaders
