
## Riding Club Completes Its Extension of Bridle Path

#### OPEN BUDGET DRIVE

Set \$12,000 as Goal in Annual North Shore Area Boy Scout Fund Campaign; Fowler Is Treasurer

One hundred and fifty men of the north shore villages are at work raising the budget to carry on the work of the North Shore Area council, Boy Scouts of America. The plan for the new year's work calls for an increased budget for a growing organization.

The number of Scouts in the area has nearly doubled in the last year. Two full time men are needed to assist the committeemen and volunteer leaders in the 150 square miles of territory. A Service station where records and supplies are kept is maintained at Highland Park where Scouts, parents, and leaders may be served.

Henry Fowler of Wilmette, treasurer of the council, is general chairman of the budget and finance committee. The men directing the work in the various towns are: Benjamin Cox, Wilmette; Harry Harrison, Kenilworth; Harry Stannard, Glencoe; Albert Snite, Highland Park; Louis Ortmeyer, Highwood; Dr. George Roberts, Lake Forest; J. W. Strong, Deerfield; P. W. Beda, Glenview. Chairmen of other towns have not as yet been selected.

The budget will provide for the equiping of the Cabin-in-the-woods in the Forest Preserve west of Glencoe, which is used by the various troops for overnight hikes. It is planned to have the campaign concluded by October 25. The quota for the entire area is \$12,000.
