"No, I haven't. Is it a real movie, and are they going to produce it and show it for the public?"

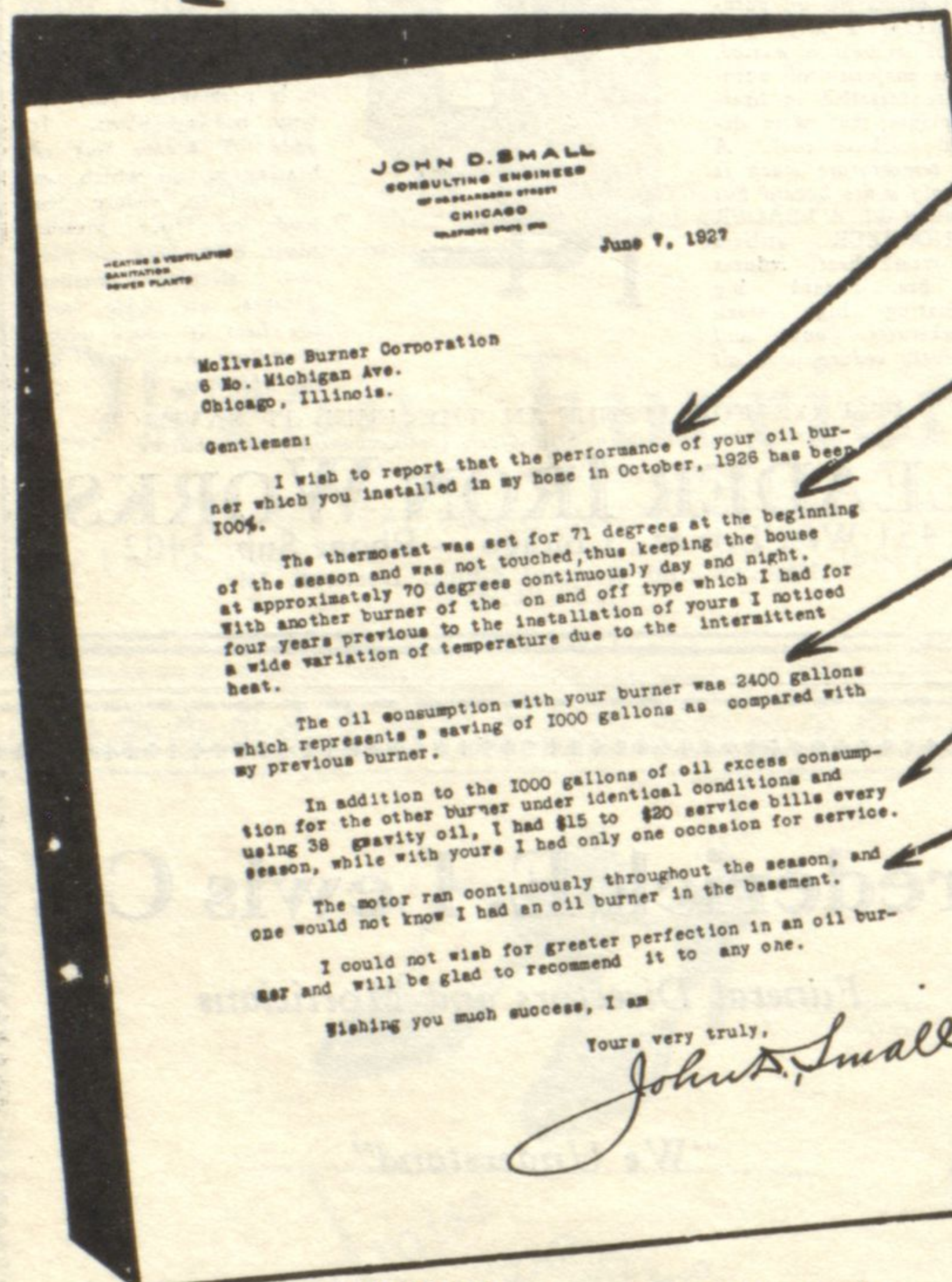

This happened quite a while ago. The picture is finished, now, much to the satisfaction of the actors and all others concerned.

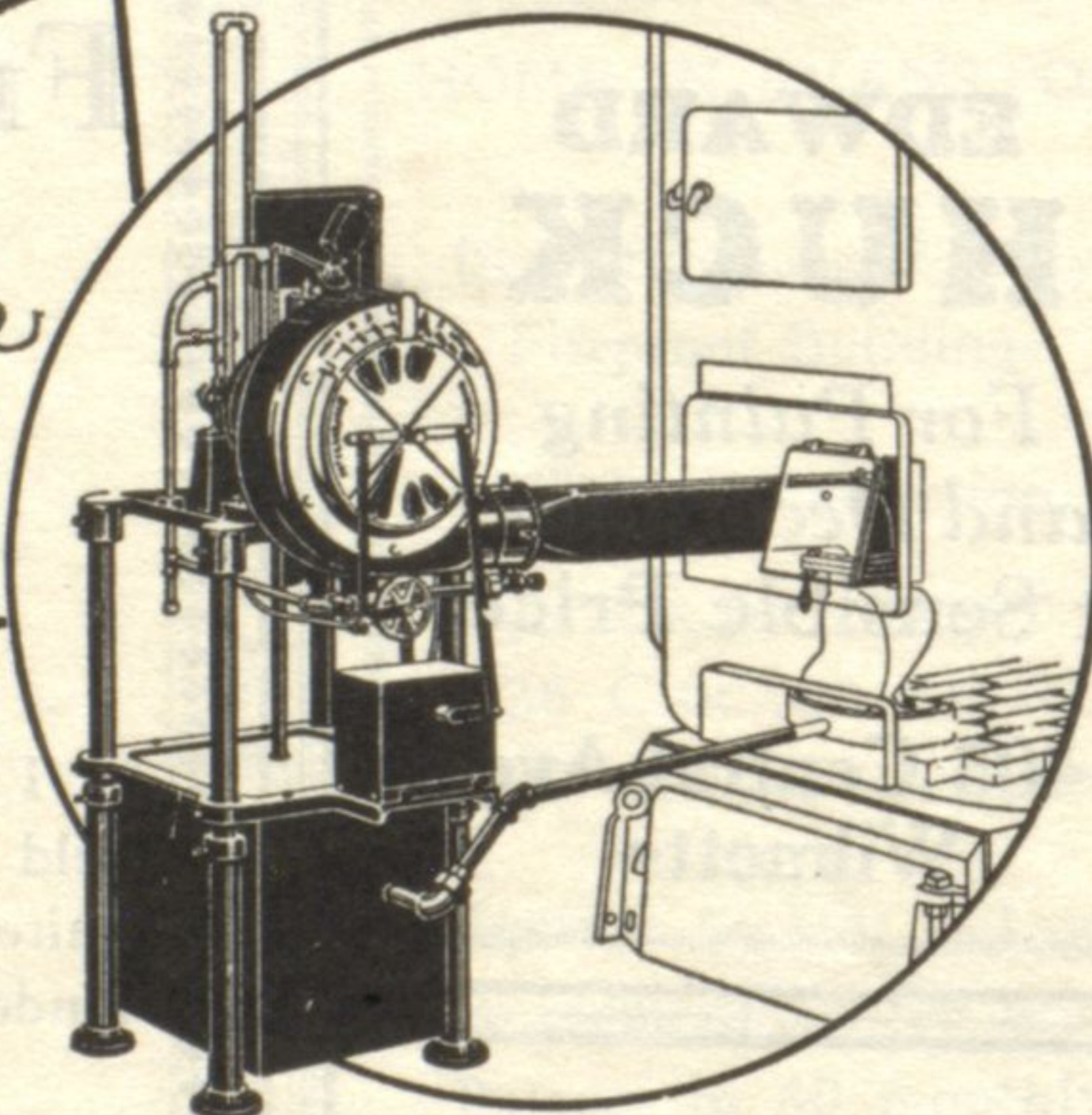
