#### Second Artist Recital Concert on November 7

The second concert of the Artist Recital series, now being given under the auspices of the Winnetka Music club, will be given Monday evening, November 7, in the New Trier High school auditorium. The program will be in the form of a joint recital presented by Wanda Landowska, noted pianist and harpsichordist, and Nina Morgana, a soprano of unusual distinction.

The career of Miss Landowska is considered by musicians as a chronical of devotion to an ideal. She was born in Warsaw, where at fourteen she was graduated from a conservatory, and shortly thereafter went to Berlin to study composition. In Berlin she became interested in the study of ancient manuscripts and instruments of the classic period and soon became not only one of the leading artists but also an authority on ancient music.

Miss Morgana is an American artist and has achieved fame in both Europe and America. On the advice of Caruso, for whom she sang in 1908, she studied in Milan and made her debut in the LaScala Opera House in that city. Since then her fame has steadily mounted and she has sung with some of the leading opera companies of the world, among which are the Chicago and Metropolitan Opera companies She has toured in recital with Amato, Elman, Martinelli and Caruso.
