Hines was wrestling coach at Northwestern in 1925-26 and at present is director of physical education for boys at the National Kindergarten and Elementary college. The North Shore school of Physical Education stresses individual attention to the needs of the men, women and children enrolled. Its curriculum includes conditioning work, corrective exercises, wrestling, boxing and fencing. Numerous clients are sent to the school by north shore physicians.

Mrs. Mabel Klein Dies Suddenly at Residence Here

Mrs. Mabel Carleton Klein, wife of Arthur F. Klein, passed away suddenly at her home, 369 Hawthorne lane, last Friday night as she was dressing for dinner. She had been apparently in the best of health and had not complained of being ill previous to her collapse. Death was attributed to embolism. Final rites were conducted from the home last Monday afternoon with the Rev. James Austin Richards officiating.

Mrs. Klein was born in Chicago and received her High school education at the old West Division High school, now the McKinley High school, located at 2040 West Adams street, Chicago. It was here that she first became acquainted with Mr. Klein, whom she married in 1905. To this union in subsequent years were born three daughters, Virginia, Janet and Babbett. The young couple first took up their residence in Oak Park and there made their home for a period of eight years. In about 1914, following brief residences in Berkeley, Cal. and in Winnipeg, Canada, they removed to Winnetka and have made their home in this community for the past 13 years.

Mrs. Klein enjoyed a vast acquaintance in both Oak Park and on the north shore and was dearly beloved by all of her many friends. She was a member of the Winnetka Congregational church, the Winnetka Woman's club and the Winnetka League of Women Voters. In each of these organizations she was actively interested and devoted much of her time to the promotion of their interests.

She was also very much interested in her children's school work and personally supervised their education. Each of them was enrolled in the Roycemore school in Evanston and Mrs. Klein clearly demonstrated her rare personality and ability in her assistance in their school work.

She is survived by her husband and three daughters.
