135 Hubbard Woods Pupils Subscribe to School Paper

Over one hundred and thirty-five year subscriptions to the "Journalist," Winnetka school paper which is published by the children, have been sold in the Hubbard Woods school to date, it was announced this week.

There will be 12 issues of the "Journalist" this year, according to those in charge of its editing. Six of these will be in "news-magazine" form and the other six in regulation newspaper style.

In the magazine issues, a cover design prepared by the Art department of the Skokie school will be used and regular pages will be assigned to the individual schools. Short stories by the children and other articles will also appear.

The news editions, however, will be devoted almost altogether to the publishing of short news items about the schools and members of the faculty and student body. "The Journalist" is edited by staffs chosen in each of the Winnetka schools and is printed by the printing classes at Skokie school, under the direction of Wayne L. Claxton.
