Dr. Stifler has been in his present charge for more than 18 years and has

long been a prominent and popular figure not only in the Baptist denomination but in various connections throughout Evanston and Chicago. He is now president of the Evanston Charities and was recently president of the Kiwanis club of Evanston.

Dr. Stifler is an author of note, his first three books being series of essays on the Religious Life, entitled "The Fighting Saint"; a study in Luke and Acts entitled "The Christ of Christianity," and "The Religion of Benjamin Franklin." Only this month a new volume based on the letters of Benjamin Franklin and entitled "My Dear Girl" has come from the press.

The Stifler brothers are the sons of Dr. J. M. Stifler, for many years professor of New Testament Language and Literature in one of the theological seminaries of the East. They have served in adjoining parishes on the north shore for more than ten years.

Rev. Francis C. Stifler will occupy the pulpit of the First Baptist church at Evanston this Sunday.
