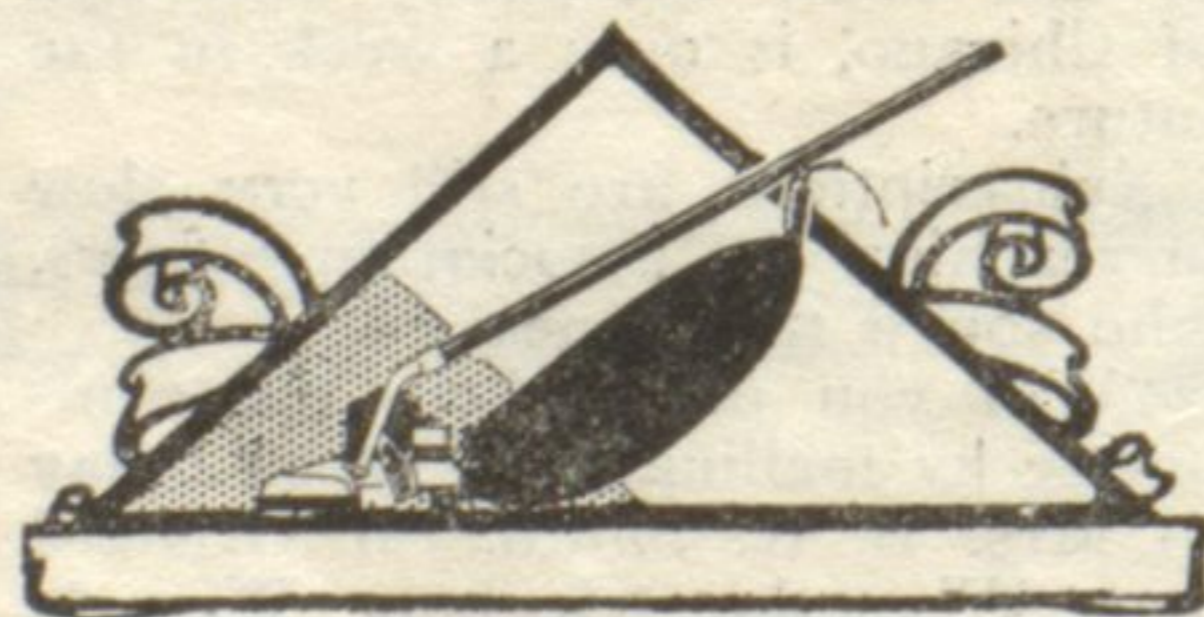
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Appoint Delegates to State Convention of Voters' League

Mrs. Montague Ferry and Mrs. Ralph Sherman Childs were appointed this week by Mrs. M. Vander Vries, president of the local chapter of the League of Women Voters, as official delegates from Winnetka to the State convention which is to be held in Peoria on November 15, 16 and 17.

Mrs. Ferry, who is the first vice-president of the Winnetka League and chairman of the organization committee, will attend the sessions of the State convention dealing with the particular part of local activities in which she is most interested.

Mrs. Childs, who is the member of the Winnetka board in close contact with the Cook County Council and the Chicago League of Women Voters forum, will report the program work of the convention.

Mrs. Vander Vries will also attend the convention and will preside at the dinner for the local presidents and state board members to be held the night preceding the opening of the convention.

The Winnetka League, due to its large membership, is entitled to a large number of delegates to the convention and Mrs. VanderVries is anxious to receive the names of members who desire to attend the convention.

Zoning Committee Studies Filling Station Projects

The request of the Pennsylvania Oil company for permission to erect a filling station at the southwest corner of Scott and Linden avenues, Hubbard Woods, was once more up for discussion by the village council Tuesday evening, and was again referred to the plats and zoning committee, of which Trustee Doris D. Benson is chairman, for further consideration, with special reference to pedestrian traffic at that point.

A request from the Winnetka Coal & Lumber company for a permit to erect a gasoline filling station at the northwest corner of Spruce and Center streets, was also referred to the plats and zoning committee.

OUTLINE ACTIVITIES FOR EDUCATION WEEK

North Shore Organizations Join in Gala Festival Commemorating Sherman Lodge

New Trier High school has formulated plans to observe American Education Week, November 7-13, inclusive. Two special Parent-Teacher gatherings at the school will comprise the outstanding features of the program, though one took place this week, when parents visited the classrooms, and the second follows on Thursday, November 17.

The purposes of American Education week, observed generally throughout the country, are "to acquaint the public with the actual work of the schools, with their ideals, their achievements, and their needs." The aim is to have every parent visit his child's school at least once during this week.

"The schools," reads an announcement, "aim to benefit the entire life of the child and the whole life of society by working toward the following cardinal objectives, which provide fitting Education week subjects as follows:

Sound health, worthy home membership, mastery of the tools, technics, and spirit of learning, faithful citizenship, vocational effectiveness, wise use of leisure, ethical character.

Quoting further from an announcement:

Urge Deeper Understanding

"Let the week be a time of deeper understanding on the part of the people of the role education has played, is playing, and must play in the life of our great democracy. That nation is greatest that puts the child first in its thinking, in its statecraft, in its business, in its ideals of conduct. The nation that has the highest regard for childhood will lead all others in health, intelligence, morality, efficiency, and happiness. It will reach the greatest heights of national prosperity, both material and spiritual. The race moves forward through its children."

The Education week program may be briefly outlined as follows:

Monday, November 7—Health Day—Build the program around the fact that sound health is the foundation of individual happiness and community well-being.

Tuesday, November 8—Home and School Day—In working out the program for this day let the central thought be that the home is the most fundamental institution among all civilized peoples.

Wednesday, November 9—Know Your School Day—The Central thought of this day's program is the school itself. The schools are the first and biggest enterprise in nation, state, county, or city.

Thursday, November 10—School Opportunity Day—Build the program around "opportunity," stressing particularly the opportunity which the school should offer the child; inspire pupils to take advantage of the opportunities before them.

Armistice Observance

Friday, November 11—Armistice Day—Armistice Day provides the opportunity for a program of the highest patriotic quality. It marks the day when the thought of the world changed from war duties to the peaceful pursuits of life and to the duties of citizenship.

Saturday, November 12—Community Day—The program for this day should emphasize the value of schools in the improvement of community life. The schools should participate in the various activities of the day.

Sunday, November 13—For God and Country Day—On this day let ministers of all denomination address their audience on the higher values of education and on the work of teachers and the schools.
