

CENTRAL COMMITTEE IS NEW WINNETKA VENTURE

**Groups Interested in Education
Combine Resources for Con-
certed Effort**

A new Central committee has been formed, whose function will concern everyone in Winnetka who is interested in education. This committee is composed of one representative from each of the public schools, one from New Trier High school, one from North Shore Country Day school, and one from the Winnetka Woman's club. Each delegate is the chairman of the Parent-Teacher association, or the dean of the school, or the chairman of education, in each school or organization represented.

Co-operative Effort

The function of this committee is chiefly to be a clearing-house for ideas, suggestions, and programs on education, so that the schools and clubs will work together in an integrated way, instead of separately in a scattered way. This will result in a selection of the best possible speakers for each group, in fewer meetings, planned so that no dates conflict, or come too close together; and the exchange of ideas will foster a co-operative spirit among all the schools. Also there will be one or two community meetings during the year, with speakers of distinction. A joint financing and fostering of such a project will be a benefit to the whole community, because an important speaker can be brought to Winnetka through joint effort, whom no one organization could afford to have.

Lastly, the function of the committee will be to exchange and broadcast announcements of importance. If there are any special meetings of general interest at the Woman's club or at the different schools, every one in the Village will be invited to attend. Every school meeting in the future will contain announcements of open meetings on education.

the North Shore Country Day school; Miss Elizabeth Packer, for New Trier High school; Mrs. Howard A. Gray, for the Winnetka Parent-Teacher association; Mrs. Austin D. Jenkins for Skokie school; Mrs. Myron T. Harshaw for Greeley school; Mrs. John R. Reilly for Horace Mann school; Mrs. Robert Brown, for Hubbard Woods, and secretary of the committee; and Mrs. S. George Levy, for the Winnetka Woman's club, and chairman of the Central committee.

Dr. J. W. F. Davies, associate minister of the Winnetka Congregational Church, has been appointed by Secretary Hoover as chairman of a committee to conduct a Better Homes campaign in Winnetka.

Mr. Hoover is president of Better Homes in America, an organization which each year sponsors a nation-wide educational campaign for Better Homes. The organization maintains headquarters in Washington, D. C., with James Ford in charge as executive director.

Better Homes in America was established to provide local communities with information as to the ways of improving housing conditions and home life, the work being carried on in communities through volunteer committees of local citizens. The campaign is sponsored locally by such organizations as Parent-Teacher associations, women's clubs, civic associations and others having an interest in home improvement.

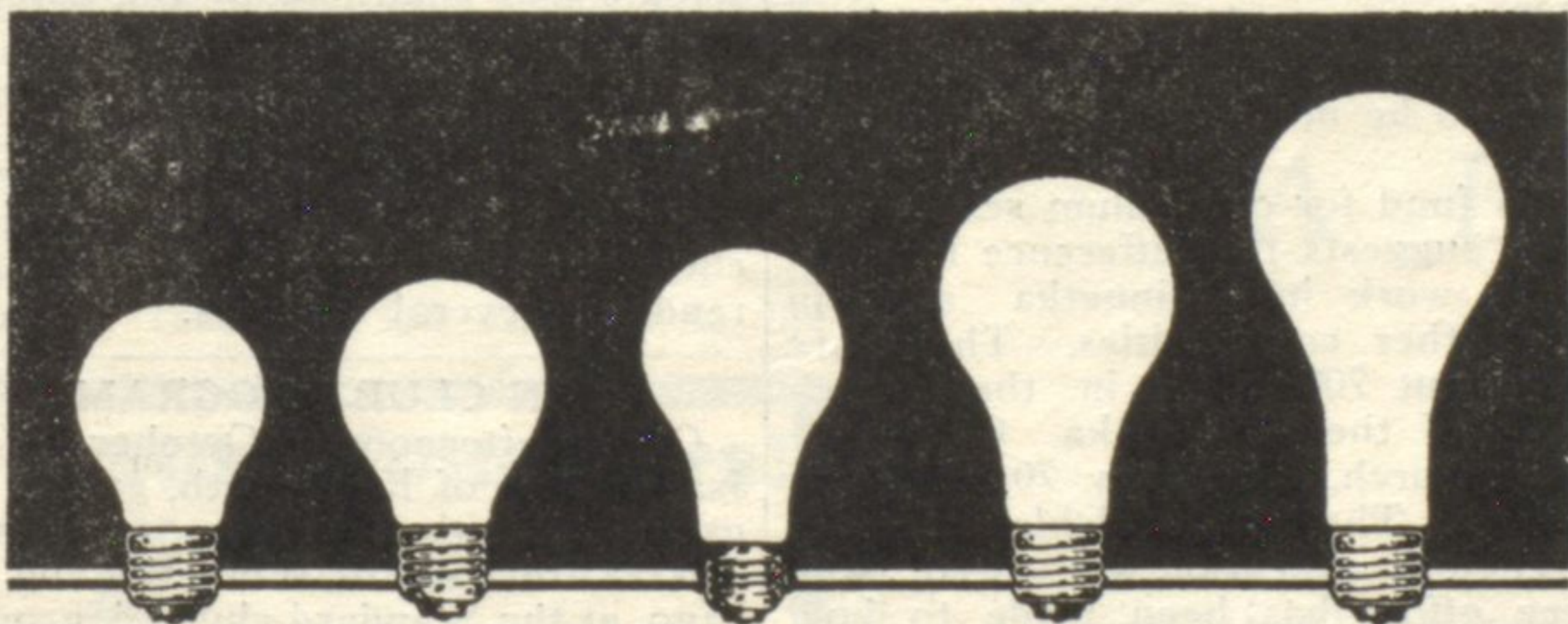
