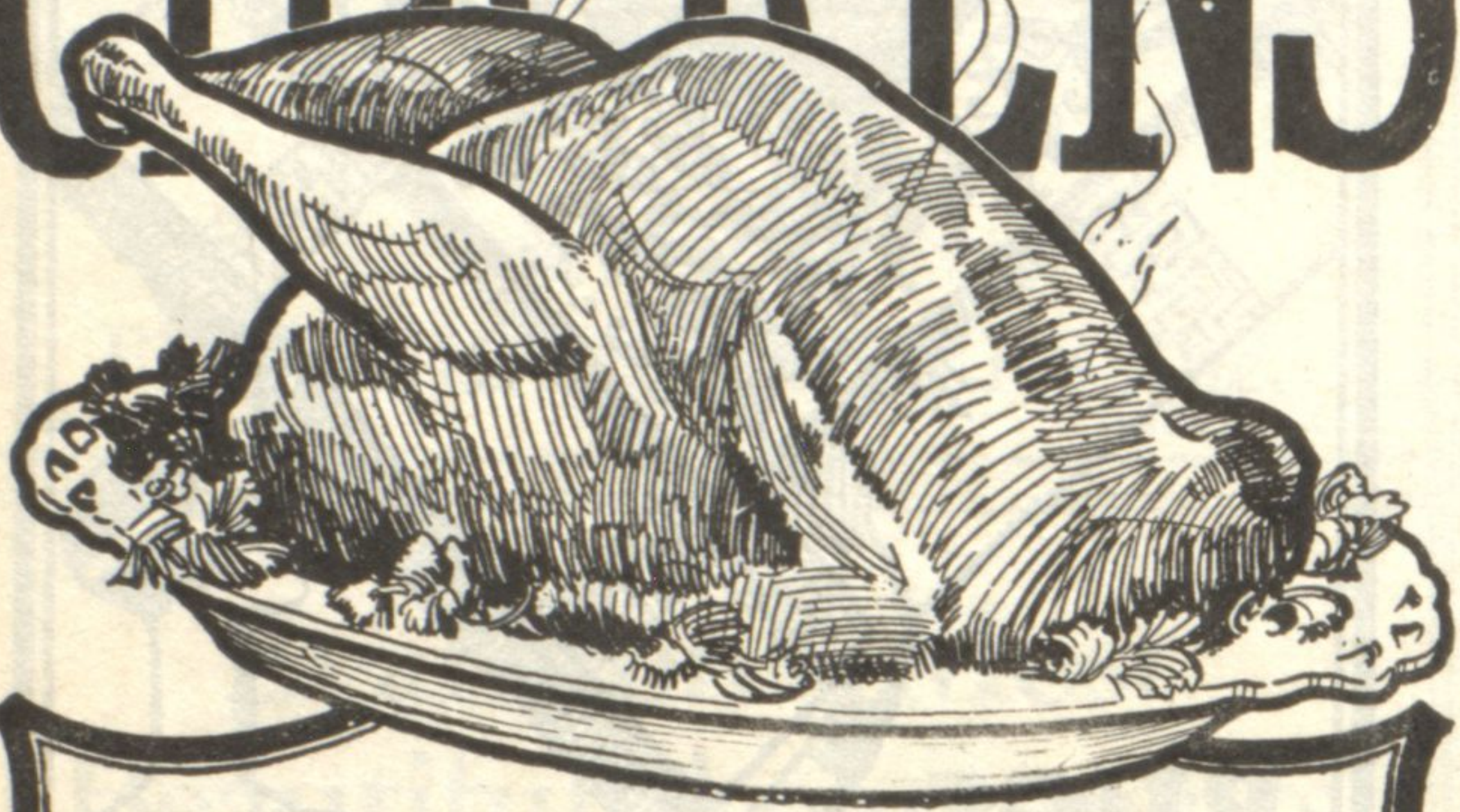

## Sunset Ridge Plans Big Improvements; Cost to Be \$81,000

Sunset Ridge Country club believes in the uplift movement and is out for bigger and better clubhouse accommodations and bigger and better golf. This is indicated by a statement issued yesterday calling attention to the building program for 1928.

The club proposes extensive additions and improvements to the club property and to accomplish this is to spend the huge sum of \$81,000. Here's how the money is to be spent:

New furniture, furnishings and equipment for club house	17,000
<b>Total</b>	<b>\$81,000</b>

The popularity of Sunset Ridge has been established and it is expected there will be no difficulty in carrying out the program. It is stated that the position of the club is such that the valuation of club memberships may be increased to \$1,400 and that bonding to the extent of \$50,000 in addition to raising the membership to permit twenty-five new members to join will enable the club to go through with the scheduled improvements.
