

Winnetka Policeman Dies When His Gun Fires by Accident

Patrolman Dudley C. Everett, of the Winnetka police department, accidentally shot himself Friday night of last week inflicting a wound from which he died a few hours later.

The accident occurred at his home, 786 Foxdale avenue. Mr. Everett, who was retiring, was in the act of placing his revolver under the pillow of his bed when it was accidentally discharged. The bullet entered his body about an inch below the heart.

A coroner's inquest was held at the Frederick E. Lewis and company, funeral parlors, 1124 Central avenue, Wilmette, Monday morning.

Mr. Everett was 41 years of age and a veteran of the World war. He is survived by his widow and three children.

The funeral was Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock from the residence to Sacred Heart church, Hubbard Woods. Burial was at Sacred Heart cemetery near Northbrook, where services were conducted by the American Legion, Mr. Everett being a member of Winnetka Legion post.

Wally's Golf Hints

Editor's Note: Following is the first of a series of golf lessons written by Wally Chamberlain, professional at Glen-coe Golf course and head of the North Shore Golf school, Winnetka, in which, from week to week will be presented many helpful hints for those who are just taking up the game of golf, as well as those who have been playing for some time but admit the need for improving their game.

In the first place care should be taken with the stance. There is more than one stance which can be used, but for most players and the beginner the easiest to understand and take correctly each time is the square stance.

First, take an imaginary line drawn from your object back through your ball. Then stand at a distance away from your ball which is comfortable for you, and with the toes of both feet on another line paralleling the line you have already drawn through the ball. Have the ball even with your left heel.

If, when you sole your club-head behind the ball and let your arms hang straight down from your shoulders and your hands are approximately four inches away from your body you will be about the correct distance from the ball. Do not have your left arm and the club shaft in a straight line with each other. The arms extend down almost straight while the shaft of the club angles down from your hands to the ball, making a sharp angle.

Do not stand straight or bend over too much. Let your knees bend in just a little and be relaxed all the time.

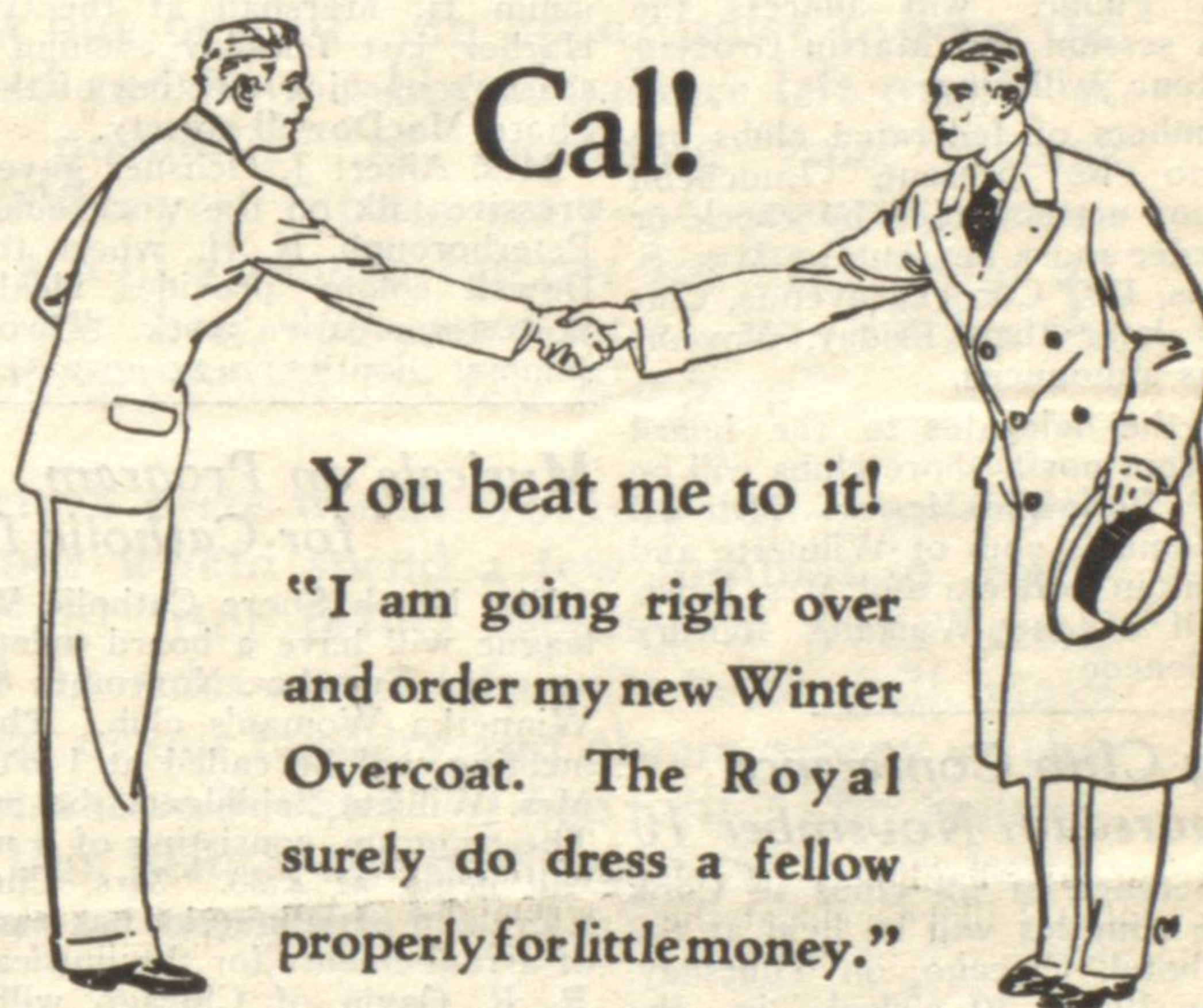

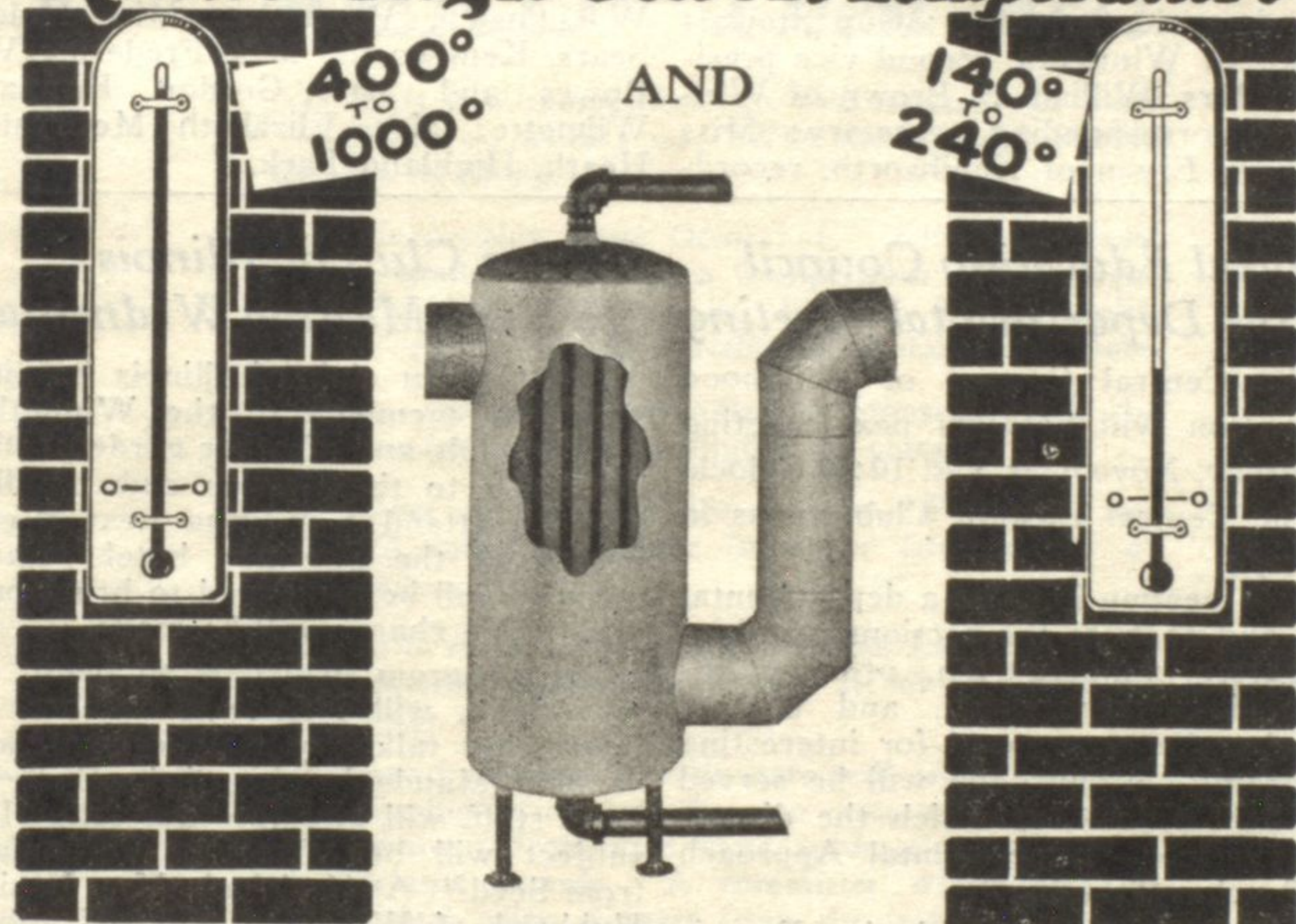
