The Chi Omega sorority is sponsoring a Lolly Pop Hop at the Evanston Woman's club Friday evening, November 11.

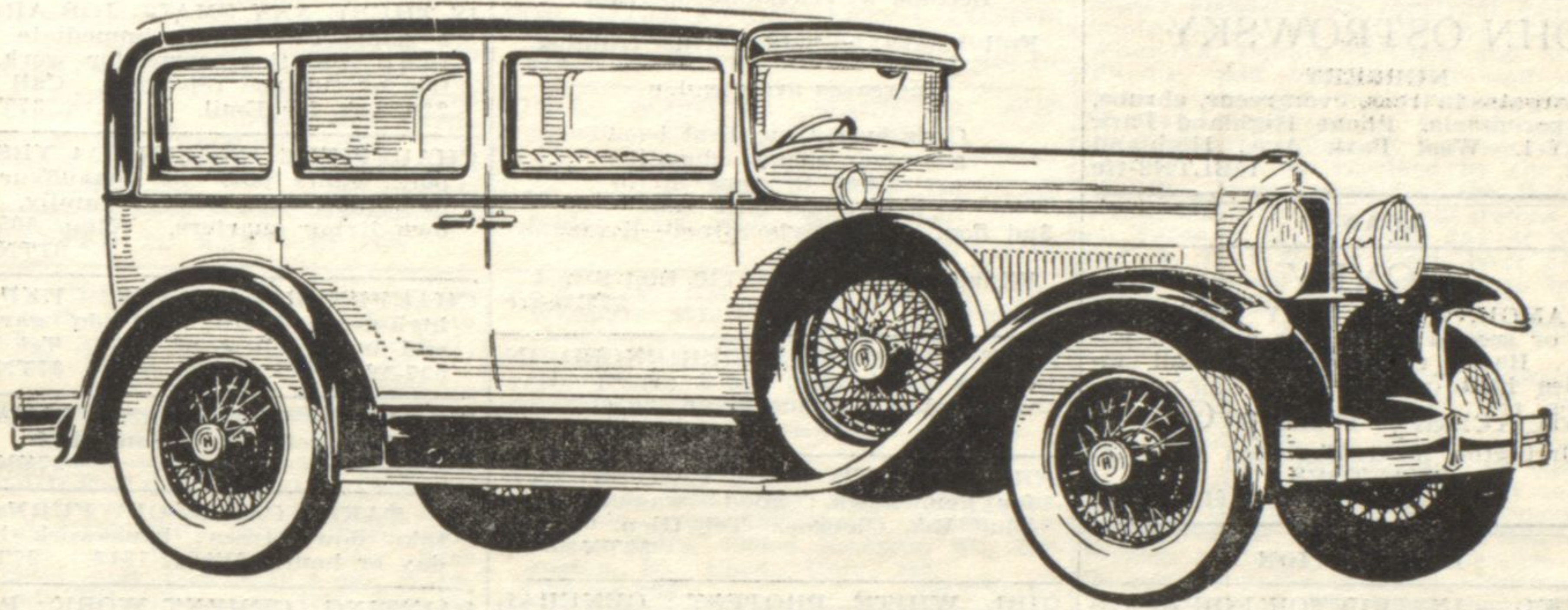
