A prize of a book is being offered to the first boy or girl of the school who submits the correct answers to a list of questions which have been compiled. No answers will be accepted, however, before November 21.

The contest is the first of its type ever to be held in Winnetka and is attracting considerable comment and approval. It is, in addition to the fun it furnishes for the children, an excellent means of learning how much they retain from their reading and causes them to be very observative while reading for pleasure.

In addition to the contest a special assembly program will be held in which the children will dress to represent some character in a book and the remainder of the pupils will endeavor to guess the title of the story.

Under the rules of the contest, while the books may be read by or read to the children, the questions must be answered without the aid of any other person. The answers must be written out and in each case the name of the author and the title of the book must be given. The numbers of the answers must also correspond with the numbers of the questions.

The list of questions is as follows:

2. Who came down the hill with a bundle on her back and let the merry little breezes out of the bundle to play on the plain?

4. Who said: "Your father had an accident there. He was put in a pie by Mrs. McGregor?"

5. What is the name of the little wooden boy who had many adventures?

6. In what book do we have a story about Kit and Kat?
7. Who, after living alone on a desert

of a man's naked foot on the shore?

8. Who said to herself: "If it had 750 Elm St.

grown up it would have made a dreadfully ugly child, but it makes a rather handsome pig, I think?"

9. Who was called from Puddlyby-onthe-Marsh to cure sick monkeys in Africa?

10. To whom did a water rat call out, "Stop him, stop him, he hasn't shown his pass!"?

11. What two children came upon a gingerbread house in the woods?

12. By means of what wooden animal and in what story is an army enabled to

enter a city?

13. What was the name of the doll who had a gold bracelet with her name

on it?
