## Skokie Pupils to Have Typewriting Course This Year

Pupils of Skokie school will have the opportunity to learn typewriting and receive elective credit for the work.

Last spring many children, after consulting with their parents, expressed a desire to learn typing, even if they had to supply their own typewriters. So this year the course will be offered to pupils wishing to take typing, whose parents approve, and whose programs permit of this extra work.

The present plan is to have the course continue through twenty-four weeks, with thirty minutes instruction daily. Credit is to be given on an a chievement basis, and the high schools are to be asked to allow credit on this same basis.

The teacher has only one period available, so each pupil must have his own machine. It is hoped that next year the schedule will be arranged so that each machine can be used by several children.

Portables will be used because they are cheaper, more convenient and more adaptable to the grade use. The children are to provide their own machines but the school will aid them in the purchase or rental of typewriters.


As only a limited number of pupils can be given this opportunity this year those who work rapidly and steadily will be given the preference.
