Plant Elm Trees on Parkways in South Winnetka

Elm trees, three inches in diameter are being set out in the parkway on Briar, Meadow and High streets in the new Indian Hill section of Winnetka, south of Winnetka avenue, where eight new residences have been erected since last spring.

Streets in this section were paved during the past summer and the assessment for the improvement includes the setting of trees in the parkway, which work, however, had to be postponed until this fall. A number of additional trees are also being placed on Winnetka avenue at this time.

In addition to the eight new houses erected in the area between Winnetka avenue and the south limits of the village, a number of new homes have also been built just across the line in Kenilworth. The south line of the lots fronting on Meadow road is the dividing line between the two villages at this point.

The new residences in this vicinity are all in the \$15,000 class, or over, and, with the coming of spring, it is said many more are contemplated.

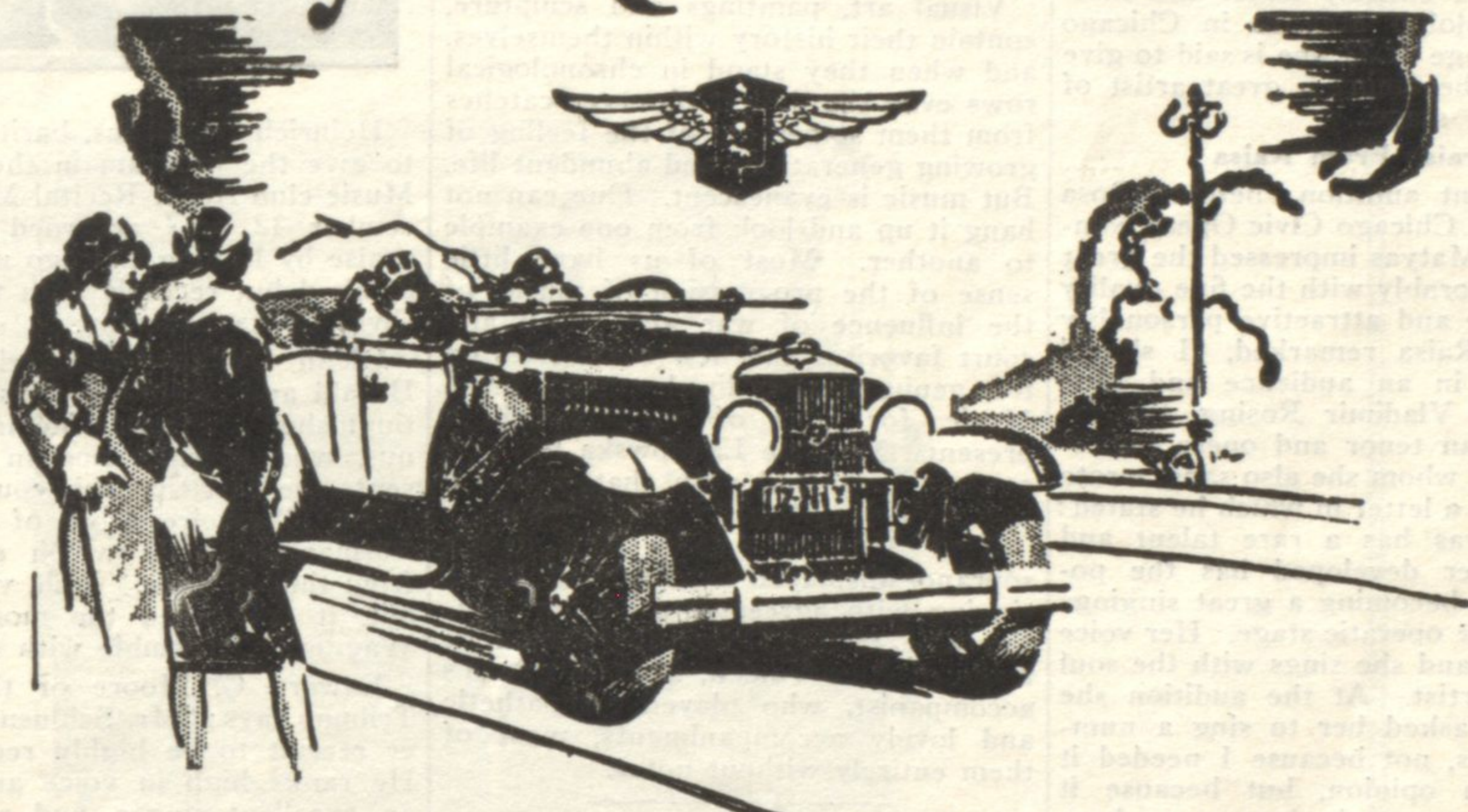
Joseph Pick, who has been visiting relatives in Winnetka, has returned to his home in Omaha.
