In the third scene the father receives a message from his daughter. He sends for the tanner, but only the artful flattery of his other daughter causes that worthy person to go.

In the fourth scene he kills the dragon and throws him into the ocean. There the dragon is turned back into a prince by the queen of the mermaids.

In the last scene he appears at the court and is forgiven and receives the king's pardon and the princess's hand in marriage. The tanner marries the other daughter.


Walter says he would rather swing a golf club any day than a snow shovel, and when he read the weather forecast for the week, he felt it was time to go. He played golf in the
