## Kenilworth Voters to Cast "White Ballot" for Trustee

Kenilworth voters will formally approve at the polls next Monday the selection of Richard Wolfe, 414 Essex road, Kenilworth, as Village trustee to fill the vacany caused by the untimely death of former Trustee Alexander M. Lovedale, who passed away following a short illness on August. 29.

The election will be held in connection with the election on the proposed establishment of the Mosquito Abatement district. Attention of the voters is called to the difference in time set for balloting in the two elections. The Village election will be held between the hours of 7 o'clock in the morning and 5 o'clock in the afternoon, while the mosquito polls will open at 6 o'clock and will close at 4 o'clock. In order to receive ballots for both elections it will be necessary therefore to vote between the hours of 6 and 4. The polls will be located in the Village Hall. Attention is also called to the fact that any voter may vote at the established voting place in any of the affected municipalities on the mosquito proposition.
