OPEN FOURTH SEASON OF VESPER CONCERTS

Wilmette Baptist Church Secures Chandler Goldthwaite as Soloist December 11

The Fourth season of Vesper concerts at the Wilmette Baptist church, under the direction of William Harrison Barnes, will begin Sunday, December 11, with the first recital of the year at 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

For this concert, Mr. Darrie bringing for a return engagement, bringing for a return the brilliant young musician, who is still remembered for his startling artistry a year ago when he made his first appearance in Wilmette.

Mr. Goldthwaite is not yet 30 years old. He is a natural musician who, although entirely self-taught, was found to have developed at the age of 16 a remarkable piano technique which furnished the foundation of his great success as an organist in later years.

Before Mr. Goldthwaite was 23 years old he had been chosen city organist in St. Paul, Minn., one of the most prominent positions to be held by any organist in this country.

Symphony Soloist

For the past four years Mr. Goldthwaite has devoted himself to concerts in America and Europe. At home and abroad he has appeared both in recitals and with some of the leading symphony orchestras. He has recently been appearing with Gabrilowitsch in Detroit and with the symphony orchestras of Minneapolis and Cleveland. When one remembers how rarely it is that organists are asked to have a part on symphony orchestra programs, one appreciates how rare is Mr. Goldthwaite's genius.

In fact, Mr. Goldthwaite's popularity is almost unparalleled in the history of the American Organ. Repeatedly when he was in St. Paul, the crowds were so great that special police were called upon to handle the situation. The same situation has developed elsewhere when his name is advertised.

Mr. Goldthwaite has made records for five different organ companies which is acceded itself to be a record. He has been heard on the air from many stations.

It is only through the long-time friendship with Mr. Barnes that there would be any possibility at all of having Mr. Goldthwaite for the local program. He will appear unassisted in the following arrangement of attractive numbers:


