Walter Holmer, Moline, Ill., boy and half back of the Northwestern university football team, is the Purple grid captain for 1928, succeeding Vic Gustafson of Wheaton, who graduates in June. Holmer was elected Friday night at the annual Harvest home dinner of the Northwestern University club of Chicago at the Hotel Sherman.

He is a junior in the school of commerce and has played two years on the Wildcat team. His first year as a regular was spent as an understudy for the Purple ace, "Tiny" Lewis, and consequently, not much of Walt's ability was demonstrated on the gridiron. This season, however, he was shifted to halfback, where he starred on several occasions.
