

**Country Day Starts

Wally's Golf Hints

Editor's Note: Following is the sixth of a series of golf lessons written by Wally Chamberlain, professional at Glencoe Golf course, and head of the North Shore Golf School, Winnetka, in which, from week to week will be presented many helpful hints for those who are just taking up the game of golf, as well as those who have been playing for some time but admit the need for improving their game.

One way which can be used to keep the left side up is to turn the left hand a little bit to the right in the back swing. Not a roll, but just enough to put the left hand over the right at the top of the back swing. This will automatically force the right elbow down and also will help to keep the left side up.

It is a simple matter when you are in this position at the top of your swing to come from the inside with an underhand throw with the right hand. Do not go too far over with the left hand or you will be flat, which is not necessary. Just experiment until you find just the amount you need to keep your left shoulder up and work at it until it stays up without any effort.

You will find then you can swing almost any way and still keep your shoulders level.
