Former Glencoe Resident Dies at Chicago Hospital

Funeral services for Jacob Nielson, a former resident of Glencoe who passed away at the West Side hospital in Chicago following an operation, were held from the Schaffer Bros. chapel in Evanston yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment was at Memorial Park. Mr. Nielson was 77 years of age and moved to Glencoe in 1882 and lived there until about eight years ago, removing to Paris, Ill., and later to Chicago.

He is survived by his widow and seven children: Mrs. J. M. Johnson of Evanston, Mrs. George Embleu of Pittsburgh, Mrs. J. W. Jenks of Paris, Ill., Mrs. Harry Otto of Naples, N. Y., Mrs. Arthur H. Cox of Van Nuys, Calif., Oscar Nielson of Omak, Wash., and Paul Nielson of Seattle, Wash. Mr. Nielson also leaves 22 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
