JOHN DEHMLOW AND 1927 RETIRE TODAY

Veteran Officer of Winnetka Police Department Leaves Service After 28 Years Faithful Duty

The closing of the old year today, to Officer John Dehmlow, veteran member of the Winnetka Police department, means far more than the casual passing of the twelve months period designated as 1927.

It also marks the termination of his career as a policeman, and his retirement, after twenty-eight years of faithful service as an officer, throughout which he has enjoyed the happy associations of scores of fellow officers and the confidence and high esteem of the public, all of which have been fully merited by his own individual conduct and close application to duty.

Retires on Pension

Officer Dehmlow is now seventy years of age and retires on pension. His Chief, W. M. Peterson, announced today there will be no formal farewell to their veteran friend and officer, but something of this nature is contemplated a little later, following the close of the holiday season.

John Dehmlow leaves the service with the well wishes of every member of the village family going with him.

Officer Dehmlow has been a resident of Winnetka 33 years. For thirty of those years he has been in the employ of the village, being associated with the street department prior to joining the police force.

For several years John Dehmlow has endeared himself to the children of Horace Mann school, at Elm and Chestnut streets, where, with faithful vigilance each morning, noon and evening of school days, he guarded the little tots from harm as they passed this busy corner to and from school.

His services, in late years, particularly, have also been of inestimable value to the department in his courteous, but efficient work in directing automobile parking regulations of the village.

Sticks to His Bike

Police cars and motorcycles have been added to the department equipment during John Dehmlow's connection therewith, but he has remained faithful to his bicycle, on which he traveled about on his varied duties.

Mr. and Mrs. Dehmlow reside at 892 Elm street. Their son, Walter Dehmlow, conducts the Winnetka Brunswick shop at 570 Lincoln avenue; Charles, another son, formerly with the Winnetka postoffice, also resides in Winnetka, as does their daughter, Mrs. John Dethloff, whose husband conducts a men's furnishings store at 786 Elm street. A third son, Edward, resides in Highland Park.
