

Bach Solo Chorus to Appear at Sunday Club

The Chicago Bach chorus was founded by Rev. Paul Sauer and Musical Director William Boeppler in 1925. Its aim is to perform J. S. Bach's works for chorus and orchestra, organ and solo voices, exclusively. Through well prepared concert performances, the transcendent beauty and greatness of Bach's monumental works, especially of his too little known cantatas, are to be revealed to the lovers of the best in the realm of music, with the final aim to bring his sacred music back to the lofty place for which it was written—to the church.

The Bach Chorus debut in Orchestra hall was a sensational success. Acclaimed by critics and audiences alike, and received in its last concert with even greater enthusiasm than before, it continues to grow and strive for the steady improvement in its work and the constantly nearer approach to the fulfillment of the great responsibility which its name and its aim imply.
