**School Children
 to Get Practical
 Hygiene Lesson**

The fleet of delivery trucks operated by the Schultz and Nord, tailoring and cleaning establishment at 1152 Central avenue, Wilmette, will be doing extra heavy duty during the next two weeks, which have been designated Hygiene Weeks observed by that concern in the interest of the school children of the community.

Hygiene Weeks are intended to convey a practical lesson in hygiene to school children. During the fourteen-day period all school children in the community under the age of 12 years will each be invited to have a garment cleaned by Schultz and Nord, free of charge, the object being to impress upon the minds of the little folks the fact that cleanliness in attire is one of the essentials to good health along with the other more commonly acquired habits of cleanliness emphasized in home and school training.

The plan is to clean free of charge, one garment for each child, the garments to be called for and delivered in the regular way by the Schultz and Nord trucks. These garments will all be cleaned in the plant operated by the concern, it is explained.
