

### New Trier Tank Men to Encounter Englewood Champs

New Trier High school swimmers will take on the mermen from Englewood High school, this Saturday night at New Trier.

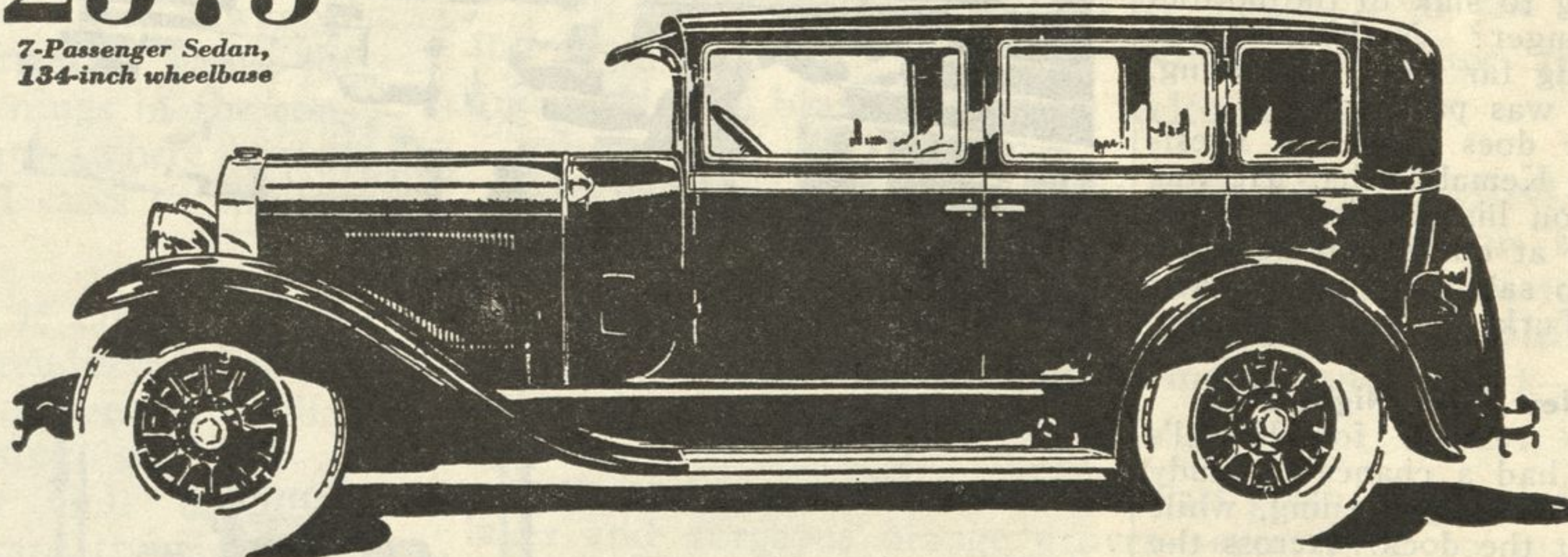
