in the budget. Installation of the McCormick road lights will be completed early this spring. For the work remaining to be done \$550,000 was appropriated. Thousand candle power units are being used, erected on concrete lamp standards placed opposite each other and having 100-foot centers.

For the landscaping of the west banks of the c'annel \$150,000 was allowed in the budget.


