# At the North Shore Theaters

## "In Old Kentucky" Showing At Teatro This Saturday

"In Old Kentucky," "The City Gone Wild," "Get Your Man," "The Wizard" and "Her Wild Oat" are the feature attractions at Teatro del Lago during the coming week.

"In Old Kentucky," the film showing this Saturday, is one of the best racing pictures which has ever come to the screen from a directorial, color and acting standpoint.
