Charles W. Cole, a resident of Winnetka for 35 years, died February 2 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. William Henrichsen of Pasadena, Cal. He had been ill with double pneumonia for less than a week. Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon in Pasadena, and burial will be held early next week at Fond du Lac, Wis., where two of Mr. Cole's children, and his wife, who died May 21, 1927, are buried.

At the time of his death, Mr. Cole was 74 years old. He retired six years ago from service with the Chicago and Northwestern railroad and went to California to make his home with his daughter. He had been with the railroad for 49 years.

Surviving Mr. Cole are his two daughters, Mrs. Henrichsen and Mrs. A. M. Kloefer of 325 Linden avenue, and a son, Leonard, of 468 Ridge ave. Winnetka.

From this point on, the Panthers played a defensive game, while their opponents fought like wildcats.

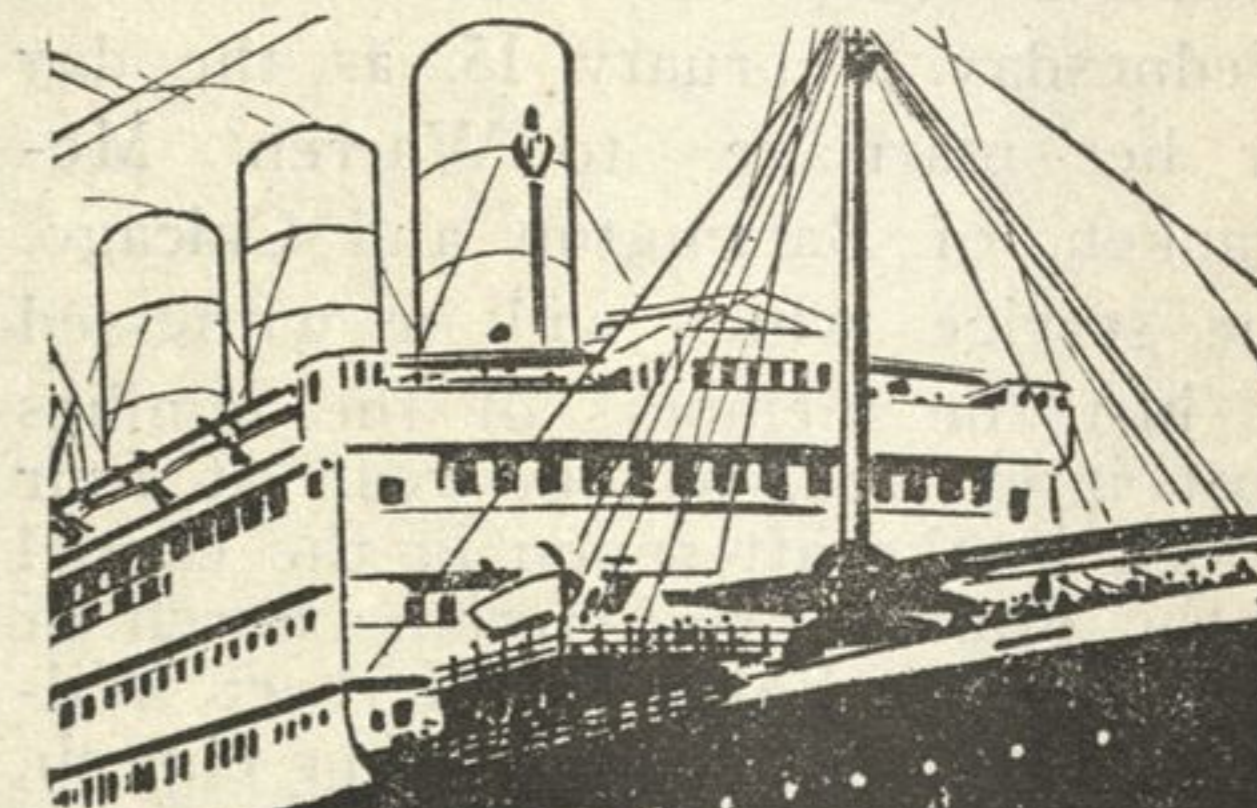

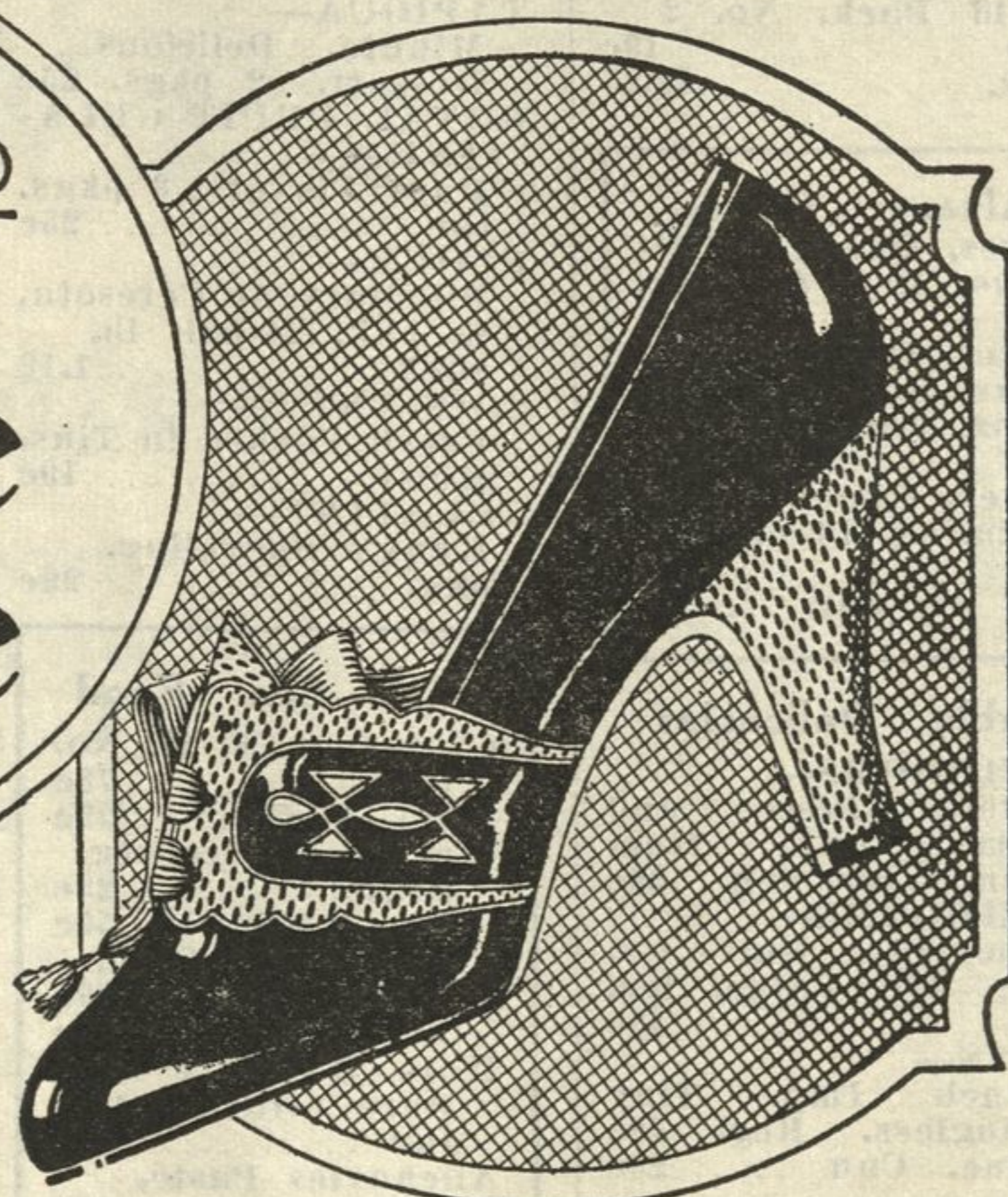

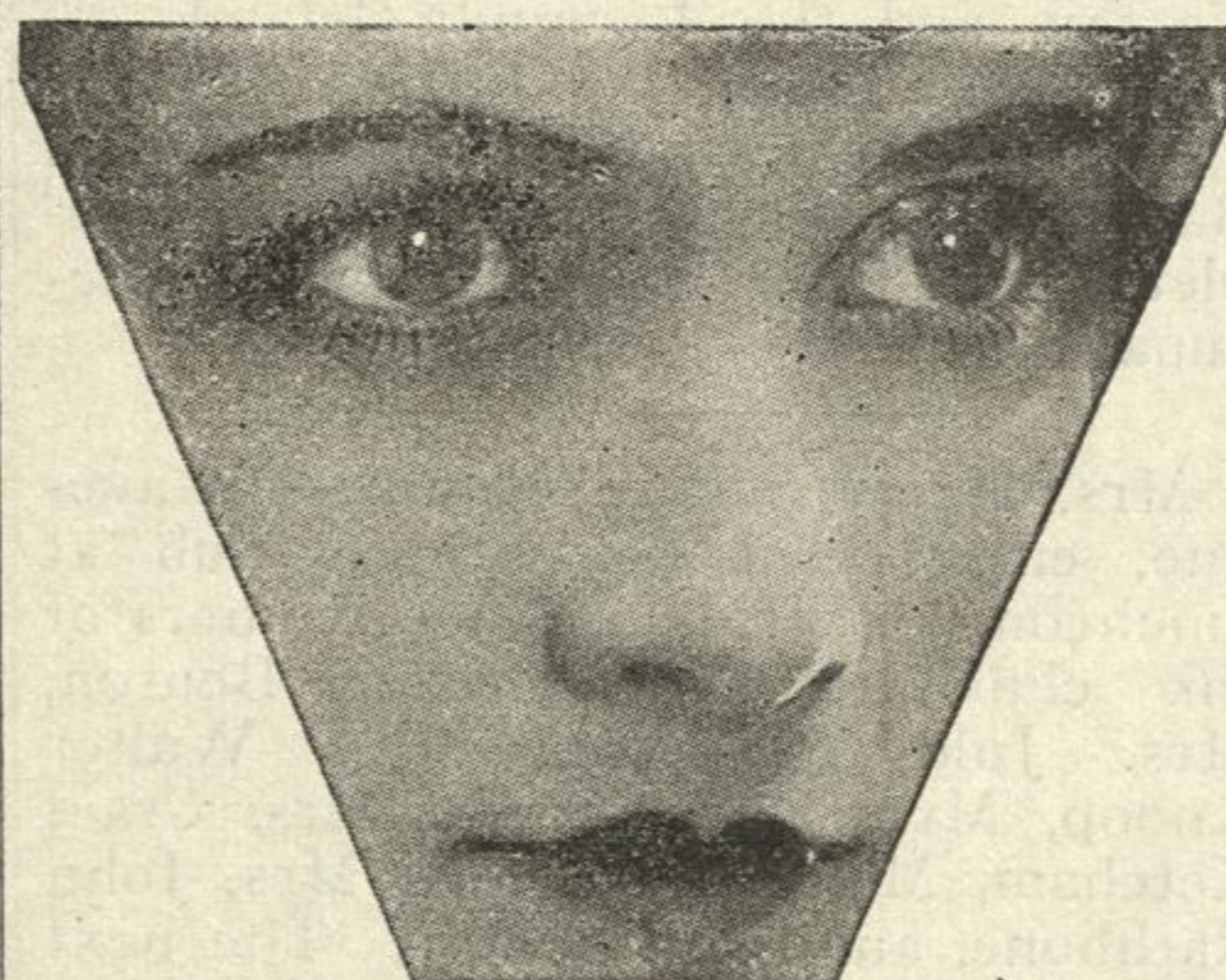
