

### RAISE 1928 FUNDS FOR COMMUNITY HOUSE

**Total Budget is \$28,000; Goal in Campaign to Start March 11, is \$12,000**

The Governors of Community House announce that the campaign for the annual maintenance expense will be held on Sunday afternoon, March 11.

District No. 15 is composed of the business districts in the three sections of the village and will be canvassed by a committee consisting of Herbert Paulson, William Wersted and E. A. Anderson.

The foregoing men attended a luncheon Friday evening at which time plans for the campaign were discussed.

The total budget for Community House for 1928, is approximately \$28,000, of which \$12,000 is the goal set in this campaign. The remainder of the budget is to be secured from other sources.
