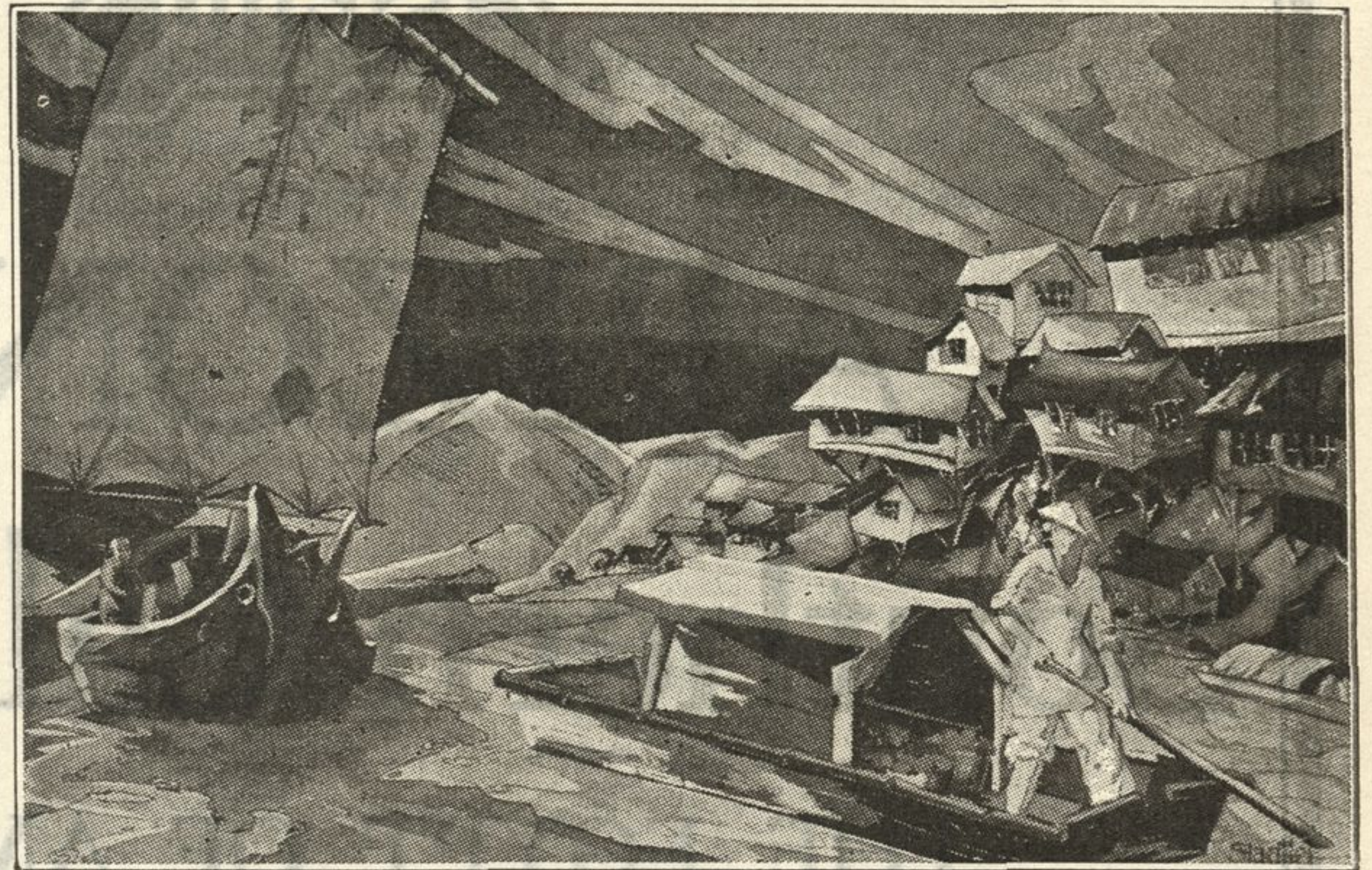

What a wonderful profession, full of real enjoyment! Surely one cannot imagine that this student created this picture without feeling the thrill and romance of the scene.

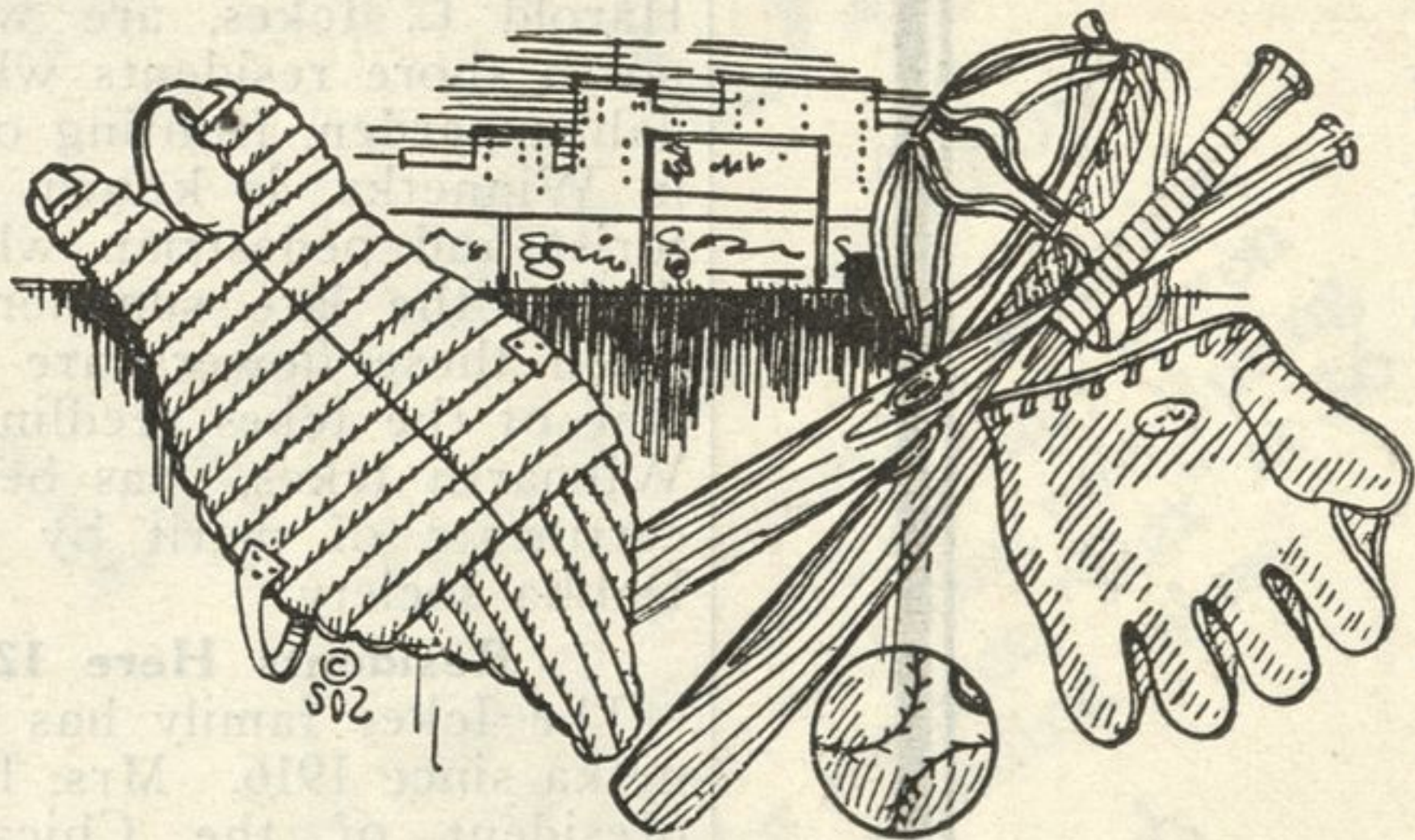
