It soon developed into an intriguing comedy in the hands of Mrs. Eugene Rummler and Miss Katharine Shaw, each of whom played and looked her part excellently.

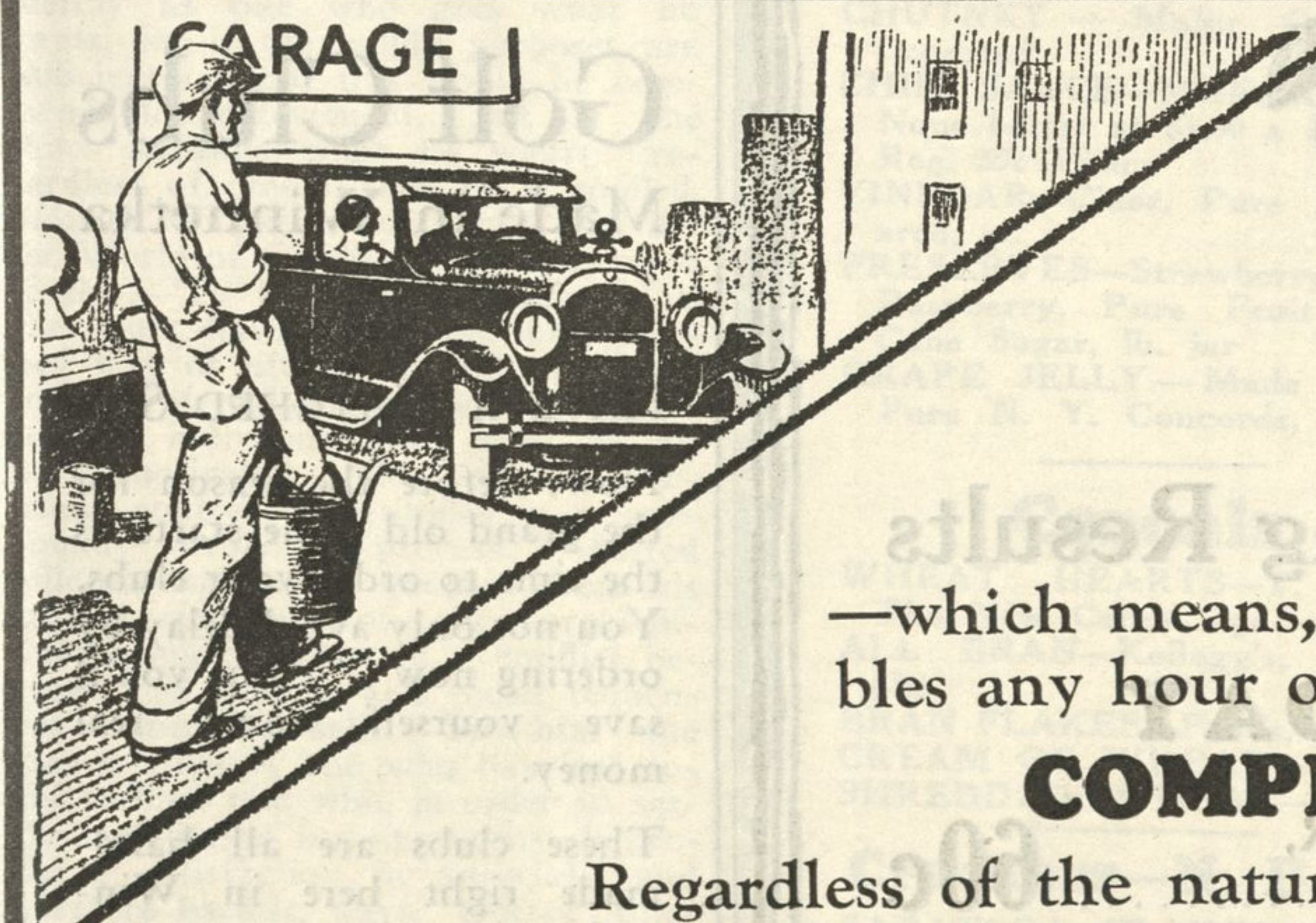
