### Invite to Free Lecture at the Field Museum

A free illustrated lecture on Madagascar will be given Saturday afternoon, March 24, at Field Museum of Natural History. Dr. Ralph Linton, leader of the Captain Marshall Field Anthropological Expedition to Madagascar, who recently returned after more than two years of exploration and ethnological research in that island possession of France off the southeast coast of Africa, is the lecturer. Dr. Linton is assistant curator of Oceanic and Malayan ethnology at the museum.

As a result of his experiences cruising with boys, Mr. Kinney has worked out plans for a very lightweight boat similar to the Eskimo kayak, very safe for boys, and simple enough in construction for the average boy of twelve to build.

One of these boats will be on display at the reunion, as an example of the type of boat which each boy may build for himself at camp this summer.

For cruising with boys the craft has proven almost ideal, being very easy to paddle, very stable, and so light in weight that it may easily be carried upon the beach at any place or any time the fleet wishes to rest or make a camp. For young boys the kayak type of craft, as modified by Mr. Kinney, has every advantage of the open canoe, plus a degree of safety impossible to the canoe, it is explained.

The program for the reunion provides for some typical camp stunts, camp songs, an initiation, the camp movies, and, most important to the boys, the camp dinner.

The Rev. Henry S. Gatley, Episcopal rector at Appleton, Wis., a member of the camp staff, will preside as official story-teller and toastmaster.
