### Women Cage Teams Will Clash in Games March 28

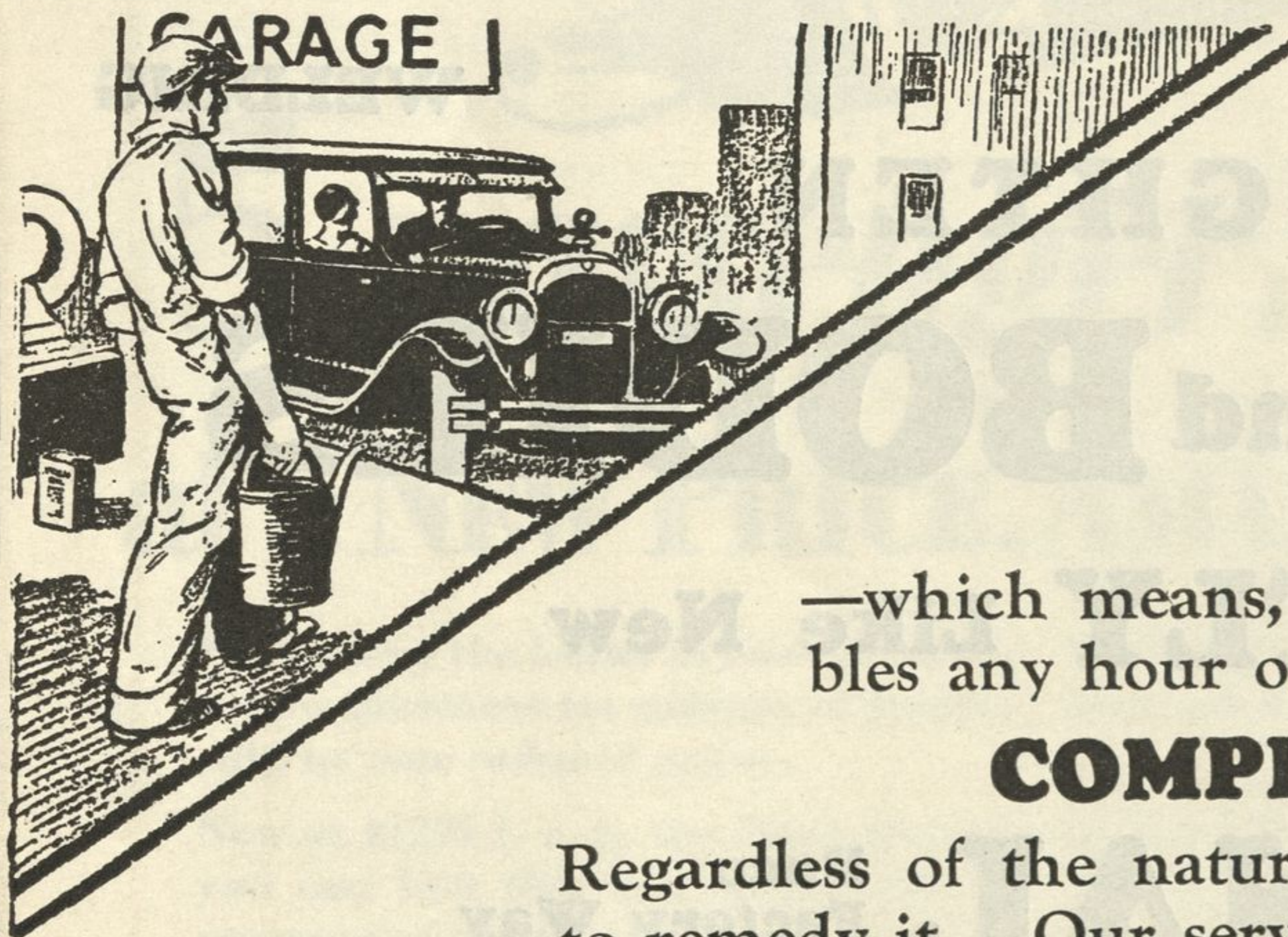
