In spite of the unexpected blizzard on Monday about 100 voters attended the candidates' meeting at Community House. Twelve candidates braved the weather to address the Winnetka voters, coming from Calumet City, Harvey, Des Plaines, Brookfield, Chicago, and Wilmette, representing the offices of sanitary district, state legislator, and state's attorney.

Not only were they given an opportunity to explain their platform, but they also had a chance to listen to an interesting and instructive talk on Home Rule by Dr. A. R. Hatton of the Political Science department of Northwestern university. The advantages of giving the municipalities the power to determine their own form of government and of handling situations which have to do only with themselves, were pointed out by Dr. Hatton as benefiting both the cities and the legislature. As author of Home Rule Amendment for the state of Ohio, and of the Cleveland Charter, he has much to teach us in the successful policy of making the voter responsible for his own community and consequent improvement in city rule.

The Izaak Walton flag, won by Winnetka in the last general election for having the largest percentage of the qualified voters at the polls, was on display and the contest was explained by George B. Massey, president of the Winnetka Izaak Walton league.
