Garland's Addition to Winnetka, including manholes, house slants or Y junctions, connections with existing sewer, trenching, pipe laying, backfilling, and removal of all surplus excavated materials, all within the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the Village Clerk of said Village, and the said Village having applied to the Superior times. #### Johnny's Golf Hints

Putting is a game within a game, and too much practice cannot be devoted to the latter. There are several methods of putting, but I will describe the style that is used by the majority of the foremost pros.

When taking the stance, keep both feet at right angles to the hole. Bend forward at the waist so that your left eye is directly over the ball and the shaft of the putter is parallel with your left leg which should be in a vertical position.

The ball is played out on a line directly opposite the inside of the left shaft and rest your hands on your left leg. This will help steady your stroke. Start the club back on a straight line with the cup, keeping the blade at right angles to the cup at all be done with your wrists, your hands remaining in a fixed position.

On starting the hit, keep the blade square to the cup, as you have on the back stroke, and keep it so, as you hit the ball, and then, to the finish of the go, when hit.

It is a little hard at first, but with brief practice you will be able to judge the distance and get better direction, if totally done with the wrists.
