To Hold School Board Elections on April 14

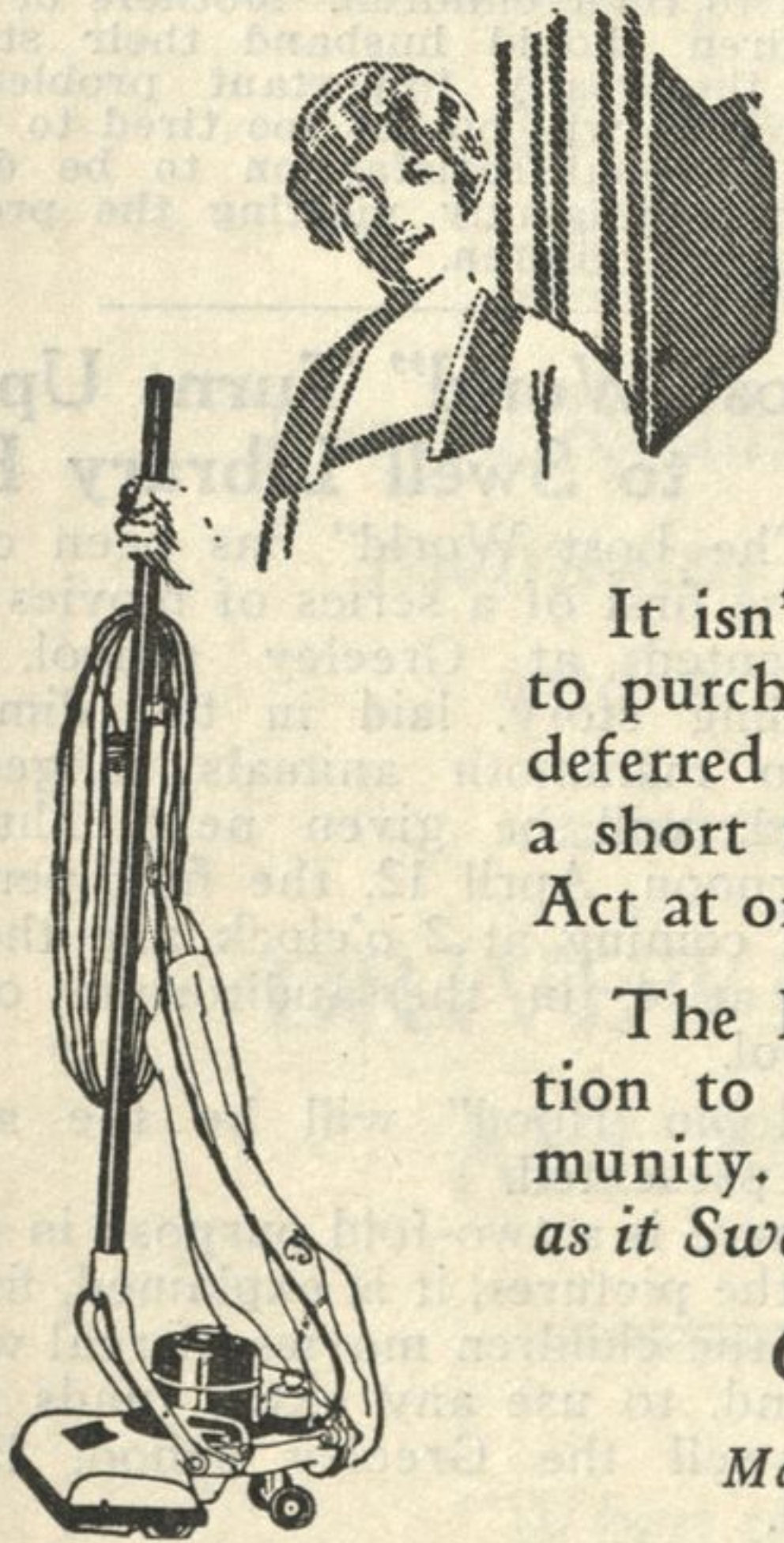
