**Near East Orphans
Express Gratitude
for Aid from U. S.**

Children under the care of America in the Holy Lands are doing their part to show their gratitude to this country, and especially to the churches for having aided them during the last decade. The International Missionary council, now convening in Jerusalem, has found that these children, who are all orphans under the care of Near East Relief, are willing and eager to serve as guides about the regions so outstanding in Bible history and to aid in every way.

A delegation of the orphans appeared before the 200 delegates attending the conference and extended their message which was: "We hope we may continue to walk in the footsteps of Christ as we have been taught to do by our great parent, America." The delegates are making a pilgrimage to Calvary, following in the footsteps of Christ in his tragic Easter journey along the Via Dolorosa.

Near East Relief is now engaged in a \$6,000,000 campaign which will complete its work in the orphanages of the Bible countries, where 32,131 children are still under American care. Near East Relief took them in along with about 100,000 more children who have been graduated and placed in homes or positions, and to finish up the work of caring for them for the next few years is vital.
