TWENTY-TWO PERMITS FOR \$163,075 IN GLENCOE

March Building Is Nearly \$90,000

More Than for Same Month

of Last Year

The value of building improvements in Glencoe authorized by permit's issued in March this year reached a total of \$163,075, nearly \$90,000 more than for the corresponding month last year. The total number of permits issued was 22, as compared to 12 last year.
