A most interesting series of conferences has been planned for each evening of Better Homes Week with a speaker of authority on the subject as leader. The meetings will be somewhat in the nature of round-table conferences, with discussion by the audience, after the main address.

Residents of Winnetka are not only cordially invited, but are earnestly urged to attend these conferences which will be held in Community House each evening at 8 o'clock throughout Better Homes Week.
